3rd December, 1969.

This day His Excellency the Governor of Northern Ireland was pleased, in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty the Queen, to give his Assent to the following Bills agreed upon by both Houses of the Parliament of Northern Ireland:

Protection of the Person and Property  
Age of Majority.

Whereas by Section 1 of the Commissioner for Complaints Act (Northern Ireland) 1969 the Governor of Northern Ireland may appoint the Northern Ireland Commissioner for Complaints:

Now Therefore I Ralph Francis Alnwick Baron Grey of Naunton Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George Knight Commander of the Royal Victorian Order Officer of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire Governor of Northern Ireland do hereby pursuant to the powers vested in me by the said Act in that behalf appoint John Meriton Benn Esquire Companion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath to be the Northern Ireland Commissioner for Complaints with effect from 22 December 1969 to have and to hold the said office during good behaviour with all the powers and duties belonging thereto and in accordance with and subject to the provisions of the Commissioner for Complaints Act (Northern Ireland) 1969 and all other Statutes in this behalf made and provided.

Given at Government House, Hillsborough this twenty-sixth day of November, 1969, by His Excellency's Command.

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that they have made an Order under Sections 9 and 13 of, and Schedule 5 to, the

Import Duties Act, 1958, and Section 2(5) of the Finance Act, 1965.

Viz:—The Import Duty Drawbacks (No. 2) Order, 1969.

This Order:

1. revokes the provisions for the allowance of drawback of import duty on tea; and
2. increases the rate of drawback of import duty on shuttlecocks and shuttlecock skirts manufactured from imported poly (11-aminoundecanoic acid) granules.

This Order comes into operation on 4 December 1969 and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1969 No. 1658.
