#### PRIMARY BATTERIES

The Minister of Technology has recently been notified by The Ever Ready Company (Great Britain) Ltd. under the early warning arrangements, of proposed increases in the prices of a wide range of primary batteries.

In view of the public interest in the prices of these products, the Government consider that it would be desirable for an independent examination of the company's proposals to be made by the National Board for Prices and Incomes.

Accordingly, the First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity and the Minister of Technology, in pursuance of their powers under Section 2(1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966, hereby refer to the National Board

for Prices and Incomes for examination and report the question of the prices of primary batteries proposed by The Ever Ready Company (Great Britain) Ltd.
