Torrent River and Tributaries, Co. Tyrone

The Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland hereby gives notice in pursuance of Section 5(1)(b) of the Drainage Act (Northern Ireland) 1947 (Reprint to 1966) that a Scheme has been prepared for the better drainage of those parts of the Torrent River and its tributaries which the Drainage Council have declared to be main watercourses within the meaning of Section 1(1) of the Act.

The part of the Torrent River to be dealt with under the Scheme flows from the County Road Bridge at Castlecaulfield between the townlands of Drumreany and Lisnamonaghan to its confluence with the Blackwater River, through or between the townlands of Lisnamonaghan, Drumreany, Mullaghacreevy, Clananeese, Glebe, Mullaghmore Glebe, Tullynure, Aghareany, Mullygruen, Donaghmore, Annaghbeg, Tullydraw, Ballybray, Killygavanagh, Tullycullion, Creevagh Upper, Lisnagowan, Creevagh Lower, Annaginny, Feroy, Agharan, Mineveigh, Woodhill, Drumey, Sessia, Drumreagh Otra, Farlough, Drumreagh Etra, Derry, Gortin, Derrywinnin Glebe, Creenagh, Gortgonis, Annaghmore, Corr, Derrytresk, Drumcrow, and Annaghbeg.

The 5 tributaries which are to be dealt with under the Scheme are as follows:

- (1) That part of the Mullygruen tributary which flows from a point 600 yards downstream of Mullygruen Lough through or between the townlands of Tullynure, Mullaghmore Glebe, Foygh into the Lough and flows through the townlands of Mullyguen, Drumkearn, Tullyleek, Garvagh and Donaghmore until it joins the Torrent River.
- (2) That part of the Mullaghmore tributary which flows from the old Londonderry-Portadown railway line through or between the townlands of Mullaghmore, Aghareany, Annaghbeg, Tullydraw, Tullygun, Tullycullion to its junction with the Torrent River.
- (3) That part of the Derraghadoan tributary which flows from a point approximately 1 mile upstream of the Torrent River through or between the townlands of Derraghadoan, Tullygun, Tullycullion, Rossbeg, Tullyodonnell, Creevagh Upper to its confluence with the Torrent River.
- (4) That part of the Mullaghroddan tributary which flows from a point between the townlands of Mullaghroddan and Lisnagleer through or between the townlands of Mullaghroddan, Lisnagleer, Lisboy, Lisnagowan, Ballybray, Killygavanagh.
- (5) That part of the Aghareany tributary which flows from a point in the townlands of Mullaghacreevy and Aghareany approximately ½ mile downstream of the Torrent River, through or between the townlands of Aghareany and Mullaghacreevy and branches into two parts before joining the Torrent River.

A copy of the Scheme may be inspected free of charge by any person during the period from 16th March, 1970 to 16th April, 1970, at the offices of Tyrone County Council, Mountjoy Road, Omagh, and at the offices of Dungannon Rural District Council between the hours of 9.30 a.m. and 5.00 p.m. Monday to Friday.
