Viz.: The Import Duties (General) (No. 1) Order 1970.

This Order removes the import duty on certain mineral substances containing talc and tremolite mainly used as a filler in paint; and on certain essential oils (not terpenes), concretes, absolutes and resinoids.

The Order comes into operation on 2nd April, 1970, and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1970 No. 462.

Viz.: The Import Duty Drawbacks (No. 3) Order, 1970.

This Order:

- (1) revokes the provisions for drawback of import duty on the exportations of cigarette boxes, tobacco boxes and cigarette cases of iron or steel;
- (2) extends the provisions for drawback of import duty on certain exported goods manufactured from imported sugar not qualifying for Commonwealth preference by removing the previous lower limit on the polarisation of the imported sugar;
- (3) provides for the allowance of drawback of import duty on exported condensed milk manufactured from imported sugar;
- (4) revises the rates of drawback of import duty on exported electrosensitive recording paper manufactured from certain imported paper; and
- (5) revokes the provisions for drawback of import duty on exported metallic yarn manufactured from certain laminated aluminium foil.

This Order comes into operation on 2nd April, 1970, and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1970 No. 464.

PRICES AND INCOMES ACT 1966

*Costs and Revenues of Independent Television
Companies*

1. In view of the changes in the pattern of costs and revenues, particularly as a result of the introduction of colour television, of persons (hereinafter referred to as "programme contractors") who are under contract pursuant to the Television Act 1964 to provide for broadcast by the Independent Television Authority programmes, or parts of programmes, which may include advertisements, the Government

considers that it is desirable that the costs (including labour costs) and revenues of programme contractors should be the subject of examination by the National Board for Prices and Incomes.

2. Accordingly, the First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity and the Minister of Posts and Telecommunications, acting jointly in pursuance of their powers under section 2(1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966, hereby refer to the National Board for Prices and Incomes for examination and report the costs (including labour costs) and revenues of the programme contractors but treating as outside the subject matter of this reference any question as to the level of the additional payments payable by programme contractors to the Independent Television Authority under section 13(1)(b) of the said Act of 1964.

Bread Prices and Pay in the Baking Industry. Direction under Section 5(4) extending the period within which the National Board for Prices and Incomes must publish their Report.

1. Whereas the First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity and the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, in pursuance of their powers under Section 2(1) of the Prices and Incomes Act 1966, referred the above-mentioned question to the National Board for Prices and Incomes for examination and have published the text of the reference in the Gazette on 6th January, 1970;

2. And whereas by Section 5(3) of the Act, but subject to Section 5(4), the Board are required to make their report so as to allow publication within three months of the said date;

3. Now, therefore, the First Secretary of State and Secretary of State for Employment and Productivity and the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, in pursuance of their powers under the said Section 5(4), hereby direct that the said period of three months be extended by three months.
