H.M. TREASURY

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that they have made an Order under Section 3(6) and 13 of the Import Duties Act 1958.

Viz.: The Import Duties (Temporary Exemptions (No. 3) Order, 1970.

This Order provides for the temporary exemption from import duty, until 7th May, 1970, of certain cleft pales of sweet chestnut.

The Order comes into operation on 9th April, 1970, and has been published as Statutory Instrument 1970 No. 536.

TELEX SERVICE

The Post Office hereby gives notice that telex service will become available from the United Kingdom, the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man to New Guinea Territory on 13th April, 1970.

The charges on and from 13th April, 1970, for telex calls made from the United Kingdom, the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man to New Guinea Territory are shown below. These charges have been fixed by the Post Office in accordance with regulation 2(2) and regulation 9 of the Telex Regulations 1965 (in force as schemes under the Post Office Act 1969) and may be revised at any time by the Post Office.

Minimum charge (3 minutes)	charge for each subsequent minute (or part-minute)

Where a call cannot be completed because the subscriber who booked the call refuses the connection when offered or does not reply, a charge of 5s. 0d. is payable.

TELEPHONE CALLS (EXCEPT DATEL CALLS)

From the United Kingdom or the Isle of Man to Panama

The Post Office hereby gives notice pursuant to regulation 21(2) and regulation 26(3) of the Telephone Regulations 1968 (which have effect under paragraph 3(1) of schedule 9 to the Post Office Act 1969 as if they were provisions of a scheme made under section 28 of that Act) that on and from 13th April, 1970, the charges for telephone calls (except Datel calls) from the United Kingdom or the Isle of Man to Panama will be as shown in Columns 1 and 2 of the Schedule to this Notice; the charges for the personal call facility in relation to such calls will be as shown in Column 3 of the said Schedule. These charges have been fixed by the Post Office in accordance with regulation 21(1)(a) and regulation 26(3) of the said Regulations and may be revised at any time by the Post Office.
