SEIZURE NOTICE

THE IMPORTED LIVESTOCK ORDER, 1958

I, Robert James Wilson, Constable, being an authorised officer for the purpose of the Imported Livestock Order, 1958, hereby give notice that on the 3rd day of August 1970 at or in the vicinity of the Mart, Ballyclare, Co. Antrim the undermentioned one (1) livestock were seized in accordance with the provisions of the said Order.

Any person claiming that the livestock were at the time of seizure his property and either

- (a) that it was not imported, removed or brought into the United Kingdom from the Channel Islands, or the Isle of Man or the Republic of Ireland, or
- (b) that it was not so imported, removed or brought in in contravention of the said Order, may give notice in writing to that effect to the Inspector or other Constable in charge at Ballyclare R.U.C. Station, such notice to be received within 21 days of the date of seizure, or, where notice of the seizure is published in the Belfast Gazette, within ten days of such publication, whichever period shall terminate the later.

If no such claim is received as aforesaid the said Order provides that the livestock shall be deemed to be condemned as forfeited.

I, Thomas Nesbitt, Constable, being an authorised officer for the purpose of the Imported Livestock Order, 1958, hereby give notice that on the 4th day of August, 1970 at or in the vicinity of the abattoir, Ballymena, Co.
