STAMP DUTIES.

WHEREAS Section 12 (2) of the Finance Act, 1899, provides *inter alia* that His Majesty's Commissioners of Inland Revenue may substitute, as respects any foreign or colonial currency mentioned in the Schedule to that Act, any rate of exchange for that specified in the Schedule and may add to the Schedule a rate of exchange for any foreign or colonial currency not mentioned therein, and that such Act shall be construed as if any rate of exchange for the time being substituted or added were contained in the said Schedule, and in the case of the substitution of a rate of exchange as if the rate for which the new rate is substituted were omitted from that Schedule. And whereas by notices duly advertised, pursuant to the said Section, in the month of August, 1920, the said Commissioners substituted certain rates of exchange for those specified in the said Schedule, and whereas under the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, and the Orders in Council made pursuant thereto, the powers of the Commissioners of Inland Revenue in relation to Taxes which the Parliament of Northern Ireland have power to impose are transferred to the Ministry of Finance for Northern Ireland. And whereas by notices duly advertised, pursuant to the said Section, in the months of July and August, 1923, April, 1924, and May and June, 1925, the said Ministry substituted certain rates of exchange for those specified in the said Schedule. Now the said Ministry hereby gives notice that they substitute the following rates of exchange for that specified in the Schedule to the Finance Act, 1899, as varied by the above-mentioned notices now in force under the said Act.

INTOXICATING LIQUOR.

Determination by the Ministry of Finance under Section 3 of the Intoxicating Liquor Act (Northern Ireland, 1923, as amended by the Intoxicating Liquor (Finance) Act (Northern Ireland), 1925, of the rates at which charges are to be imposed in respect of licences for the sale of intoxicating liquor by retail to be granted or renewed during the year ending 30th September, 1927.

In pursuance of sub-sections (3) (b) and (4) of Section 3 of the Intoxicating Liquor Act (Northern Ireland), 1923, as amended by the Intoxicating Liquor (Finance) Act (Northern Ireland), 1925, the Ministry of Finance hereby determines that the rates at which charges are to be levied in respect of all licences for the sale of intoxicating liquor by retail or granted or renewed during the year ending 30th September, 1927, shall be eighty per cent. of the maximum rates of charge authorised by sub-section (1) of Section 1 of the Intoxicating Liquor (Finance) Act (Northern Ireland), 1925:

THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS FOR NORTHERN IRELAND.

PUBLIC HEALTH (IMPORTED FOOD) REGULATIONS, 1925.

The Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland hereby gives notice, in pursuance of the above-mentioned Regulations, that the Ministry hereby recognises for the purposes of item (b) of

the Second Schedule to the Regulations, i.e., lard, dripping, edible tallow and similar rendered fats, the official Certificate of which the particulars are given in the Schedule to the Notice published by the Minister of Health in the "London Gazette" of the 29th June, 1926, as evidence that the meat to which it relates has been derived from an animal which was free from disease at the time of slaughter and has been dressed or prepared and packed with all necessary precautions for the prevention of danger to public health.

The recognition is subject to the conditions set out in the heading to the Schedule, and applies only if (1) the package containing the meat is securely bound in strong wire sealed with a leaden seal bearing on each side a device in the form of a broad arrow; (2) the label is securely affixed to the package; and (3) the label has not in any other circumstances or on any other occasion been used as an Official Certificate.

The official Certificate recognised for the purpose of item (b) of the second Schedule to the Regulations relates to the following country:—

TRADE BOARDS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1923.

BOOT AND SHOE REPAIRING TRADE BOARD (NORTHERN IRELAND).

The Trade Board established by the Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland under powers conferred by the Trade Boards Act (Northern Ireland), 1923, for the Boot and Shoe Repairing Trade in Northern Ireland as defined in the Schedule to the Trade Boards (Boot and Shoe Repairing Trade, Northern Ireland) (Constitution, Proceedings and Meetings) Regulations, 1925, dated 30th July, 1925, hereby give notice that they propose to fix minimum rates for certain classes of male and female workers and to cancel minimum rates in their application to certain classes of male indentured apprentices.

On request to the Trade Board particulars of the Board's proposals with information as to their application will be given if, in the opinion of the Trade Board, the applicant is likely to be affected thereby.

The Trade Board will consider any objections which may be lodged with them within one calendar month from the twenty-fourth day of July, 1926, in the case of their proposal to fix minimum rates and within fourteen days from the said date in the case of their proposal to cancel minimum rates. Such objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Boot and Shoe Repairing Trade Board (Northern Ireland), Office of Trade Boards, 7 Upper Queen Street, Belfast. It is desirable that persons making objections should state, as far as possible, the precise grounds for their objections.

KILKEEL RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL.

Notice of Application by The Kilkeel Rural District Council for a Special Order under Section 26 of the Electricity (Supply) Act, 1919, to acquire compulsorily and to use land for the purpose of an Electricity Generating Station and for the generation, sale and distribution of electricity by the District Council within the limits of the townland of Rostrevor, etc.

THE KILKEEL RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL (hereinafter called "the District Council"), whose Office is at Kilkeel, in the County of Down, hereby give Notice that they intend making application to the Electricity Commissioners for Northern Ireland for a Special Order authorising the District Council to acquire compulsorily and to use land for the purpose of an Electricity Generating Station, and the generation, sale and distribution of electricity by the District Council within the limits of the townland of Rostrevor in the Kilkeel Rural District and County of Down. And that it is proposed that overhead Electric lines shall be put up on the roads in the said townland of Rostrevor named in the First Schedule hereto within two years from the commencement of the Order.

And that it is further proposed to obtain authority to erect overhead electric lines over the roads not repairable by the District Council as the Local Authority named in the Second Schedule hereto.

The land of which it is desired the said Order shall authorise the acquisition and use for the purposes of a Generating Station is all that piece of land situate in the Townland of Rostrevor, in the County of Down, consisting of a Garden which lies between Water Street, Rostrevor, and Bridge Street, Rostrevor, and a Lane or Passage to said Garden from Water Street, Rostrevor, and which said Garden and Lane or passage are coloured red on the Plan deposited in relation thereto at The Office of the said Electricity Commissioners.
