

I, James Patton, Sergeant, being an authorised officer for the purpose of the Imported Livestock Order, 1958, hereby give notice that on the 11th day of September, 1971, at or in the vicinity of Ulster Farmers' Mart, Market Yard, Armagh, the under-mentioned six livestock were seized in accordance with the provisions of the said Order.

Any person claiming that the livestock were at the time of seizure his property and either

- (a) that they were not imported, removed or brought into the United Kingdom from the Channel Islands, or the Isle of Man or the Republic of Ireland, or
- (b) that they were not so imported, removed or brought in in contravention of the said Order, may give notice in writing to that effect to the

Inspector or other Constable in charge at R.U.C. Station, Caledon, Co. Tyrone, such notice to be received within 21 days of the date of seizure, or, where notice of the seizure is published in the Belfast Gazette, within ten days of such publication, whichever period shall terminate the later.

If no such claim is received as aforesaid the said Order provides that the livestock shall be deemed to be condemned as forfeited.
