A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS by the Emergency Powers Act, 1920, it is enacted that if it appears to Us that any action has been taken or is immediately threatened by any persons or body of persons of such a nature and on so extensive a scale as to be calculated, by interfering with the supply and distribution of food, water, fuel, or light, or with the means of locomotion, to deprive the community, or any substantial portion of the community, of the essentials of life. We may, by proclamation, declare that a state of emergency exists:

And whereas on the twenty-fifth day of August last, We did, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, declare by proclamation, in pursuance of the said Act, that a state of emergency existed:

And whereas it is enacted by the said Act that no such proclamation shall be in force for more than one month, without prejudice to the issue of another proclamation at or before the end of that period:

And whereas the continued cessation of work in Coal Mines does, in Our opinion, constitute a state of emergency within the meaning of the said Act:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the said Act, We do, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, hereby declare that a state of emergency exists.

Given at Our Court at Balmoral, this twenty-second day of September, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, and in the Seventeenth year of Our Reign.

A PROCLAMATION FOR THE SUMMONING OF PARLIAMENT.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS on the 30th day of April, 1926, We were pleased, by virtue of the powers conferred upon Us by the Emergency Powers Act, 1920, to issue a Proclamation of Emergency:

And whereas on the 29th day of May, 1926, the 28th day of June, 1926, the 26th day of July, 1926, and the 25th day of August, 1926, We were pleased, by virtue of the said powers, to make further Proclamations of Emergency:

And whereas the Proclamation of Emergency made on the said 25th day of August, 1926, will expire after one month from the date thereof:

And whereas We have this day been pleased to make a new Proclamation of Emergency under the said Act:

And whereas it is provided by the said Act that where a Proclamation of Emergency has been made the occasion thereof shall forthwith be communicated to Parliament, and, if Parliament is then separated by such adjournment or prorogation as will not expire within five days, a Proclamation shall be issued for the meeting of Parliament within five days, and Parliament shall accordingly meet and sit upon the day appointed by that Proclamation, and shall continue to sit and act in like manner as if it had stood adjourned or prorogued to the same day:

And whereas the House of Lords stands adjourned to Thursday, the 21st day of October next, and the House of Commons stands adjourned to Tuesday, the 9th day of November next:

Now, therefore, We, in pursuance of the said Act and all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, hereby proclaim and give notice of Our Royal intention and pleasure that Our Parliament, notwithstanding that it now stands adjourned as aforesaid, shall assemble and be holden on Monday, the 27th day of September instant; and the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their attendance accordingly, at Westminster, on the said Monday, the 27th day of September.

BY THE GOVERNOR OF NORTHERN IRELAND.

WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 6 of the Petty Sessions Clerk (Ireland) Act, 1858, that it shall be lawful for the Lord Lieutenant to order and declare that from a certain time therein to be named two or more districts shall be served by one and the same person as Clerk:

And whereas by the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, the orders made thereunder and the Irish Free State (Consequential Provisions) Act, 1922, the powers of the Lord Lieutenant in this respect became vested in and are now exercisable by the Governor of Northern Ireland:

And whereas by the Petty Sessions Fees and Administration Act (Northern Ireland), 1923, it is provided that the power of the Governor of Northern Ireland to make an Order declaring that two or more Petty Sessions districts shall be served by one and the same person as Clerk shall be exercisable in respect of any districts whether they are all situate in the same county or not, and it is thereby further provided that the appointment of a person to be the Clerk of such two or more districts shall, on the first occasion for such appoint-

ment in pursuance of the Order, be made by the Governor of Northern Ireland, who shall select for appointment some one of the persons who filled the office of Petty Sessions Clerk in any of those districts immediately before the coming into force of the Order, or, in the case of the unfitness of all such persons then some other proper and fit person, and that the salary to be paid to the Clerk so appointed on the first occasion aforesaid for two or more districts shall, notwithstanding anything in Section 6 of the Petty Sessions Clerk (Ireland) Act, 1858, be such as the Governor of Northern Ireland in his discretion may fix:

Now, I, James Albert Edward, Governor of Northern Ireland, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the above-mentioned Acts and all other powers me thereunto enabling do hereby order and declare that the Petty Sessions Districts of Forkhill, County Armagh, and Newry, County Down, shall from the 1st day of October, 1926, be served by one and the same person as Clerk:

And I do further appoint Arthur William Devenish-Meares, at present Clerk of Petty Sessions for the district of Newry, County Down, to be Clerk of the districts of Newry, County Down, and Forkhill, County Armagh:

And I do further fix the salary of the said Arthur William Devenish-Meares as Clerk of both districts at the annual sum of Three Hundred and Fifteen Pounds.

The Civil Service Commissioners for Northern Ireland hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Ministry of Finance for Northern Ireland, viz..

REGULATIONS RESPECTING LIMITED COMPETITIVE EXAMINATION FOR THE SITUATIONS OF SHORTHAND-TYPIST AND TYPIST IN DEPARTMENTS OF THE CIVIL SERVICE.

1. No candidate will be eligible who has not rendered prior to the first day of the examination, and within twelve months of that day, four months' approved service as an established Typist, a temporary Shorthand Typist, or a temporary Typist in the service of the Government of Northern Ireland, including service partly in one capacity and partly in another or others.

Candidates who have not already been approved by a Selection Board appointed by the Minister of Finance or the Civil Service Commissioners will require to obtain the approval of such Board before presenting themselves for examination.

- 2. Candidates will be required to satisfy the Commissioners that—
 - (a) they are unmarried or widows;
 - (b) that they are duly qualified in respect of nationality, age, health, and character. Candidates must be not less than 18 years of

age on the 31st March, 1927.

No candidate will be eligible who is not a natural-born British subject and the daughter of a father who is also a natural-born British subject.

3. The examination will be in the following

subjects: -

Subject.	Maximum Marks.
English	300
Elementary Arithmetic	100
General Knowledge	100
Typewriting	200

No candidate will be regarded as qualified who does not attain a satisfactory standard in English and Typewriting and who does not obtain a satisfactory aggregate number of marks in the examination as a whole.

Candidates who fail to qualify in English or whose aggregate number of marks in the subjects other than Typewriting is so low as to render it impracticable for them to obtain a qualifying aggregate number of marks may be excluded from the examination in Typewriting.

4. Candidates who have qualified in the examination will be admitted to a test in Shorthand, but such test is not compulsory. The test in Shorthand will be purely qualifying and will be disregarded in determining the order of placing of candidates in the general examination.

The Commissioners may, at their discretion, give a further opportunity to candidates who do not present themselves at or who fail to pass the shorthand test, to satisfy them

fail to pass the shorthand test, to satisfy them of their attainments in shorthand.

5. Vacancies in the situations of Shorthand Typist and Typist existing at the date of the examination or occurring between such date and the 1st April, 1928, will be filled by candidates who have passed the examination (and, in the case of appointments to the situation of Shorthand Typist, have passed the test in Shorthand) and have satisfied the requirements in respect of nationality, age. quirements in respect of nationality, age, health, and character. Subject to the aforementioned considerations appointments will be made in strict order of merit as determined by the aggregate number of marks awarded at the general examination, vacancies for Shorthand-Typist being filled by the candidates highest on the list.

6. Candidates will be appointed in the manner described above to vacancies as they occur, whether they are actually serving in the Department in which such vacancies occur or not, and any candidate declining to accept an appointment offered to her will have no claim to further consideration in the matter of an

appointment.

7. On or after the 1st April, 1928, vacancies for Typist will be filled by competitive selection following an open qualifying examination, and vacancies for Shorthand-Typist will be filled by the promotion of Typists who-

(a) were already serving as established Typists at the date of the examination held under these Regulations and succeeded in passing such examination, including the

Shorthand test; or

(b) enter the Typist class by the aforesaid by subsequent examination or competition, and who satisfy the Commissioners as to their qualifications in shorthand.

(Note: In the foregoing Regulations the expressions "Shorthand Typist," and

"Typist" where used without qualification refer to permanent and established posts or the holders of such posts, and the expression "established Typist" includes a typist serving the customary probation after appointment and prior to confirmation in rank and establishment).

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice that the examination in question will be held in Belfast in March, 1927. The exact date will be announced later.

No person will be admitted to examination from whom the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission has not received, on or before the 1st February, 1927, an application, in the candidate's own handwriting, on a prescribed form which may be obtained from the Secretary.

SYLLABUS.

ENGLISH: This will include an essay or letter-writing; other tests of the command of English, e.g., the summarising of a passage, questions to test the candidate's comprehension of a passage, handwriting, spelling, copying MSS.

Handwriting will be taken into account in all subjects, and no special test will be

Spelling will be taken into account in all subjects, and in addition a special test will be imposed. This subject is regarded as of peculiar importance.

In essay or letter-writing, logical and orderly development of the subject will be regarded as cardinal merits, while incoherence, obscurity, diffuseness, needless repetition, and, above all, irrelevance will be treated as serious faults. Bad grammar, incorrect use of words or phrases, and serious errors in punctuation will also be severely dealt with.

ARITHMETIC: First four rules, simple and compound, including Imperial and metric weights and measures; simple reduction; vulgar fractions and decimals, excluding remethod curring decimals; unitary proportion.

GENERAL KNOWLEDGE: The questions set in this subject will be designed to test the candidate as regards-

(a) general intelligence,

(b) general education and information, and

(c) correct and concise expression. They will refer mainly to present-day matters, although they will not necessarily be confined thereto. A liberal choice of questions will be given.

PEWRITING: This will include copying of straightforward and tabular matter. Typewriting: Accuracy and neatness are of prime Deductions will be made for importance. corrections, deviation from text, shortage, and untidiness.

SHORTHAND: Two passages will be dictated at 80 words and 100 words a minute respectively, and the candidates will be required to transcribe their notes into longhand.

RETAIL BESPOKE TAILORING TRADE BOARD (NORTHERN IRELAND).
