The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that they have made an Order under Sections 9 and 13 of, and Schedule 5 to, the Import Duties Act 1958.

Viz.: The Import Duty Drawbacks (No. 1) Order 1972.

This Order revises the rates of drawback of import duty for certain specified linseed oil goods manufactured from imported linseed oil.

The Order comes into operation on 13th April, 1972 and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1972 No. 406.

### H.M. TREASURY

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that they have made an Order under Sections 1, 3 and 5 of the Income Tax (Repayment of Post-War Credits) Act 1959(a).

Viz.: Post-War Credit (Income Tax) Regulations 1972 (S.I. 1972, No. 374).

Under Regulations made between 1959 and 1962, a person is entitled to receive payment of his or her post-war credits on age grounds (60 for men, 55 for women) or if certain other conditions are satisfied (e.g. 26 weeks' continuous registered unemployment, 12 weeks' continuous receipt of supplementary benefit, etc).

The present Regulations provide for the payment of post-war credits to persons who do not satisfy the existing Regulations and who can produce one or more of their post-war credit certificates. Payment will be made on an alphabetic basis, on the dates prescribed in Regulation 4. A properly completed application form will be required.

Regulation 5 provides for the payment to building societies of the balance of the amounts akin to post-war credits which were credited to them during the war years. Three-fifths of the amount due was repayable under Regulations made in 1962.

### ELECTRICITY (SUPPLY) ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1948

#### No. 20 Scheme 1972

The Ministry of Commerce, in pursuance of section 5 of the above Act, has prepared a Scheme for the provision of an overhead line and associated terminal equipment to duplicate the existing 110 KV circuit between Coolkeeragh Power Station in the County of Londonderry and Omagh 110 KV Sub-station in the County of Tyrone, the route of the new overhead line being as follows:

1. A 110 KV steel tower line from a point north of Gorticross Upper (being the termination of

a recently constructed tower line from Lough Enagh Eastern) to a point east of Strabane North 33 KV Sub-station at Milltown Upper.

2. A 110 KV wood pole line from the termination of the steel tower line extension described above, to Omagh 110 KV Main Sub-station, south of Omagh, which will pass between Strabane and Knockavoe Hill, passing east of Douglas Bridge and Newtownstewart, between the River Strule and the Deers Leap, east of Knockmoyle Bridge to the Chase Farm, north of Oaklands, and thence to the Sub-station passing in a semi-circle to the east of Omagh.

Under Regulations 4 and 5 and the Schedule to Regulation 4 all electric blankets, including those approved by B.E.A.B., shall comply with the requirements of the Regulations as to markings on blankets and markings on the boxes or containers in which the blankets are individually packed.

Regulation 6 provides that goods shall be subject to the Regulations notwithstanding that they were manufactured before the coming into operation of the Regulations.
