#### H.M. TREASURY

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that they have made an Order under Sections 1, 3 and 5 of the Income Tax (Repay-ment of Post-War Credits) Act 1959(a).

Viz.: Post-War Credit (Income Tax) Regulations 1972 (S.I. 1972, No. 374).

Under Regulations made between 1959 and 1962, a person is entitled to receive payment of his or her post-war credits on age grounds (60 for men, 55 for women) or if certain other conditions are satisfied (e.g. 26 weeks' continuous registered unem-ployment, 12 weeks' continuous receipt of supplementary benefit. etc).

The present Regulations provide for the payment In present Regulations provide for the payment of post-war credits to persons who do not satisfy the existing Regulations and who can produce one or more of their post-war credit certificates. Pay-ment will be made on an alphabetic basis, on the dates prescribed in Regulation 4. A properly com-pleted application form will be required.

Regulation 5 provides for the payment to building societies of the balance of the amounts akin to post-war credits which were credited to them dur-ing the war years. Three-fifths of the amount due was repayable under Regulations made in 1962.

Regulation 6 lays down requirements for verifying applications for credits. Copics may be purchased from the Government Bookshop. 80 Chichester Street, Belfast BT1 4JY.

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that they have made an Order under Sections 9 and 13 of, and Schedule 5 to, the Import Duties Act 1958.

Viz.: The Import Duty Drawbacks (No. 1) Order 1972.

This Order revises the rates of drawback of import duty for certain specified linseed oil goods manufactured from imported linseed oil.

The Order comes into operation on 13th April, 1972 and has been published as Statutory Instru-ments 1972 No. 406.

#### TELECOMMUNICATIONS CHARGES NOTICE E11/1972

The Post Office hereby gives notice that it will be possible to make telex calls without the assistance of a telex exchange operator from the United Kingdom and the Isle of Man to Lebanon from 4th March, 1972.

The charges on and from 4th March, 1972 for telex calls made from the United Kingdom and the Isle of Man to Lebanom are as shown below. These charges have been fixed by the Post Office in accord-ance with paragraph 5(3) and paragraph 12 of the Post Office Telex Scheme 1971 (Post Office Scheme T2'1971) and may be revised by the Post Office without notice.

Calls obtained without the assistance of an operator

- £0.79 for the first minute (or part thereof); and
- £0.79 for each subsequent minute (or part thereof).

Calls obtained with the assistance of an operator £2.37 for the first 3 minutes (or part thereof): and

£0.79 for each subsequent minute (or part thereof).
