The Keady and Warrenpoint Orders remove the members of the Keady and Warrenpoint Urban District Councils from office and provide that the functions of the Councils shall be exercised by such person as may be from time to time appointed by the Minister of Development.

The Strabane Order amends the Strabane Urban District Council (Exercise of Functions Order (Northern Ireland) 1972 in regard to the place of meetings of the Council.

POST OFFICE

SCHEME P5/1972

NOTE: The Scheme which follows this note is made under section 28 of the Post Office Act 1969 and will come into operation on 1st April, 1972, when new air parcel services to the Faroe Islands and to the Yemen (Arab Republic) will be introduced. The Scheme amends the Post Office Overseas Parcel Post Scheme 1971 by adding to Schedule 1, which sets out the rates of postage on air parcels, the rates applicable to the new services.

THE POST OFFICE OVERSEAS PARCEL POST
AMENDMENT (No. 2) SCHEME 1972

Made 21st March, 1972

Coming into operation 1st April, 1972

The Post Office, by virtue of the powers conferred upon it by section 28 of the Post Office Act 1969, and of all other powers enabling it in this behalf hereby makes the following Scheme:

Commencement, citation and interpretation

1.—(1) This Scheme shall come into operation on the 1st day of April, 1972 and may be cited as the Post Office Overseas Parcel Post Amendment (No. 2) Scheme 1972.

(2) This Scheme shall be read as one with the Post Office Overseas Parcel Post Scheme 1971 (Post Office Scheme P8/1971) (hereinafter called "the Scheme") as amended by the Post Office Overseas Parcel Post Amendment (No. 1) Scheme 1972 (Post Office Scheme P3/1972).

(3) The Interpretation Act 1889 applies for the interpretation of this Scheme as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament, and as if the Post Office Act 1953 (as amended) were an Act conferring the power to make this Scheme.

Postage rates for new air parcel services

2. In Part 1 of Schedule 1 to the Scheme, the two columns under the common heading "Air Parcels Weight", of which the first is headed "not exceeding 1 lb., or (if greater) first lb" and the second is headed "each additional lb. (or part)", shall be amended as follows:

(1) for the words "No service" opposite and referring to the words "Faroe Islands" in that Part of the Schedule, there shall be substituted in the first column "0.80" and in the second column "0.10", and

(2) for the words "No service" opposite and referring to the words Yemen (Arab Republic) in that Part of the Schedule, there shall be substituted in the first column "1.25" and in the second column "0.40".

SCHEME P6/1972

NOTE: The Scheme which follows this note is made under section 28 of the Post Office Act 1969 and amends the Post Office Overseas Letter Post Scheme 1971. The amending Scheme, which comes into operation on 1st April, 1972 provides that the postage chargeable on a new large size air letter form will be 6½p. There will be no change in the amount of postage (5p) chargeable on the smaller air letter form currently in use, which will still be available.

THE POST OFFICE OVERSEAS LETTER POST (AMENDMENT (No. 2) SCHEME 1972

Made 31st March, 1972

Coming into operation 1st April, 1972

The Post Office, by virtue of the powers conferred upon it by Section 28 of the Post Office Act 1969, and all other powers enabling it in this behalf hereby makes the following Scheme:

Commencement, citation and interpretation

1. (1) This scheme shall come into operation on the 1st April, 1972 and may be cited as the Post Office Overseas Letter Post Amendment (No. 2) Scheme 1972.

(2) This Scheme shall be read as one with the Post Office Overseas Letter Post Scheme 1971 (Post Office Scheme P7/1971) (hereinafter called "the Scheme"), as amended by the Post Office Overseas Letter Post Amendment (No. 1) Scheme 1972 (Post Office Scheme P2/1972).

(3) The Interpretation Act 1889 applies for the interpretation of this Scheme as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament and as if the Post Office Act 1953 (as amended) were an Act conferring the power to make this Scheme.

Postage on air mail packets

2. For paragraph 10 of the Scheme there shall be substituted the following paragraph:

- 10.—(1) There shall be charged and paid:
- (a) on every air letter of the smaller size, postage of 5p;
 - (b) on every air letter of the larger size, postage of 6½p;
 - (c) on every Forces air letter, postage of 2½p;
 - (d) on other air mail packets, postage at the rate specified in Schedule 4.

(2) In this paragraph, the expression "air letter of the smaller size" means an air letter which (when folded is approximately 5 9/10 inches long and 4 1/5 inches wide, and this expression "air letter of the larger size" means an air letter which (when folded) is approximately 8 3/10 inches long and 3 9/10 inches wide."

Certain printed packets, small packets and insured boxes

3.—(1) In paragraph 7 of the Scheme, after sub-paragraph (3), there shall be added the following sub-paragraph:

"(4) This paragraph does not apply to air mail packets."

(2) In paragraph 9 of the Scheme after the words "every insured box", there shall be inserted the words "(other than an air mail packet)".

CONTROL OF TRAFFIC ON PUBLIC ROADS

Station Subway, Woodhouse Street, Portadown
NOTICE OF MAKING OF ORDER

The Ministry of Development hereby gives notice that it has made an Order entitled the Control of

Traffic (Station Subway, Woodhouse Street, Portadown) Order (Northern Ireland) 1972.

Prohibiting the use by vehicles of the Station Subway (Woodhouse Street, from David Street to Park Road) with the following exceptions:

- A pedal cycle.
- A wheel chair or perambulator drawn or propelled by hand and used solely for the conveyance of a child or children or an invalid.
- A mechanically-propelled vehicle which is specially designed and constructed, and not merely adapted, for the use of persons suffering from some physical defect or disability and which is so constructed as to be incapable of exceeding a speed of 4 miles per hour on the level under its own power.

Vehicles when used in an emergency by a medical practitioner or for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes.

Vehicles being used in connection with any building operation or demolition in or adjacent to the station subway or the removal of any obstruction, the construction, maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the station subway or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or adjacent to the station subway of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraphic line as defined in the Telegraph Act 1878 or of any traffic sign.

Handcarts or hand trolleys.

Vehicles proceeding with the permission or upon the direction of a police constable in uniform.

Alternative routes for vehicles are available via Market Street/Charles Street, Castle Street/Garvaghy Road and Castle Street/Park Road.

MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS

CIVIL AUTHORITIES (SPECIAL POWERS) ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1922

I, the Right Honourable Arthur Brian Deane Faulkner, Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland and the Civil Authority for the purposes of the Civil Authorities (Special Powers) Act (Northern Ireland) 1922, in exercise of the powers conferred on me by Regulation 33 made under that Act, and of all other powers me thereunto enabling and for the purposes of preserving the peace and maintaining order do hereby order as follows:

1. An Officer of the Royal Ulster Constabulary after consultation with the local road authority for an area may designate for the purposes of this Order a zone within that area (in this Order referred to as a "designated zone").

2. Such Officer may direct that on all roads (or on such roads as may be specified in the direction) in a designated zone the use, waiting or leaving unattended of vehicles or of vehicles of such classes or descriptions as may be so specified shall be prohibited on such days, at such times and subject to such conditions as may be so specified.

3. The Officer shall take such steps as he considers to be reasonably necessary to bring to the notice of the public any designation made or direction given under this Order.

4. For the purpose of paragraph 2 of this Order a vehicle shall be treated as unattended unless at least one person not below the age of 15 is in or on the vehicle, or in the case of a motor or pedal cycle is on or beside it.

5. This Order shall not apply to:

- (a) vehicles used on duty by a member of the Royal Ulster Constabulary or of Her Majesty's Forces;
- (b) ambulances;
- (c) vehicles used by a medical practitioner, nurse or midwife and displaying a badge approved by the British Medical Association;
- (d) fire-fighting appliances;
- (e) any vehicle the use of which in a designated zone is authorised by a member of the Royal Ulster Constabulary or of Her Majesty's Forces on duty.

6. In this Order:

"Officer of the Royal Ulster Constabulary" means a member of that Constabulary not below the rank of Superintendent;
"road" includes a public or private road or footpath and any unfenced open area adjacent to a road.
