H.M. TREASURY

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that they have made an Order under Sections 3(6) and 13 of the Import Duties Act 1958 entitled the Import Duties (Temporary Exemptions) (No. 10) Order 1972.

This Order continues, until 10th September, 1972, the temporary exemption from import duty of fresh, chilled or frozen beef and veal.

The Order comes into operation on 13th August, 1972 and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1972, No. 1215.

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that they have made an Order under Sections 3(6) and 13 of the Import Duties Act 1958 entitled the Import Duties (Temporary Exemptions) (No. 9) Order 1972.

This Order provides that the goods listed in Schedule 1 shall be temporarily exempt from import duty, and those listed in Schedule 2 shall continue to be exempt from import duty, both until 1st January, 1973 or, in the case of certain items, until such earlier day as is specified.

The Order also continues the reduction, until 1st January, 1973, in the duty chargeable on certain monolithic integrated circuit linear amplifiers under heading 85.21: this temporary reduction is from 10 per cent to 3 per cent in the full rate of duty and from 7 per cent to nil in the Commonwealth rate.

As regards the exemption for equipment for use in aircraft under heading 85.15, apparatus of a type approved by the Civil Aviation Authority is listed in Civil Aviation Publication CAP 208, Airborne Radio Apparatus Vol. 2, published by Her Majesty's Stationery Office. This publication is subject to amendment, and confirmation that apparatus is of a type approved at the date of this Order should be obtained from the Civil Aviation Authority, Controllerate of National Air Traffic Services, Tels N2(c), 19-29 Woburn Place, London WC1H 0LX.

The Order comes into operation on 1st September, 1972 and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1972 No. 1209.

PUBLIC ORDER ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1951 TO 1971

taries of State, am of the opinion in consequence of information furnished to me by the Chief Constable of the Royal Ulster Constabulary that the holding of any public procession on 12th August, 1972 in the area mentioned below is likely to cause serious public disorder or to cause undue demands to be made upon the police or military forces.

Now Therefore I, the Right Honourable William Whitelaw, M.C., M.P., in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by Section 2(2) of the Public Order Act (Northern Ireland) 1951, Section 1(1)(a) of the Northern Ireland (Temporary Provisions) Act 1972, and after consultation with the Committee constituted by the Police Authority under Paragraph 15(2) of Schedule 1 to the Police Act (Northern Ireland) 1970, do hereby order that the holding of all public processions in any part of the County Borough of Londonderry lying to the west of the River Foyle, or on any part of Craigavon Bridge in the said County Borough, is prohibited at any time during the whole of 12th August, 1972.
