APPLICATION FOR PROVISIONAL
ORDER.

To alter or amend Section 102, sub-section (4) of the Bangor (County Down) Water and Improvement Act 1905 (5 Edward VII, ch. C.X.C. VI), hereinafter called "The Principal Act," and further as hereinafter set out.

NOTICE is hereby given that application is intended to be made to the Ministry of Home Affairs of Northern Ireland on or before the 23rd day of December next by the Urban District Coun-

cil of Bangor, County Down (hereinafter called "the Council") for a Provisional Order pursuant to the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878 (41 and 42 Vic., ch. 52, sec. 205) for all or some of the following amongst other purposes namely :

(1) To partially alter or amend Section 102, sub-section (4), of the Principal Act by substituting the sum of Fifty Thousand Pounds in lieu of and in substitution for the sum of Seven Thousand Pounds in said Section and sub-section mentioned, as amended by the Bangor Gas Order, 1923, which was confirmed by the Bangor Gas Provisional Order Confirmation Act (Northern Ireland), 1923, increasing said sum of Seven Thousand Pounds to Thirty-one Thousand Pounds.

(2) To authorise the Council to borrow and re-borrow money for the purposes of the intended Order on the security of the "District Fund" and the "District Rate" as defined by Section 4 of the Principal Act, and to execute, grant, and issue Mortgages, Debentures, Debenture Stock and Annuities in respect thereof, and to make provision for the payment of interest on money so borrowed and for the repayment of borrowed money.

(3) To apply Sections 103 to 112 (inclusive) of the Principal Act in respect of the monies borrowed under the provisions of the Principal Act, as altered or amended by this Order.

(4) To provide that in calculating the sum the Council may borrow under any other enactment any sums they may borrow for the purposes of the Principal Act as altered or amended by this Order, shall not be reckoned, and the powers of the Council as to borrowing and re-borrowing for the said purposes shall not be restricted by any of the provisions of the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878.

And Notice is hereby further given that on or before the 30th day of November instant a copy of this Notice, as published in the "Belfast Gazette," will be deposited for public inspection with the Clerk of the Peace for the County of Down at his Office at Downpatrick, and that on or before the same day a copy of this said Notice will also be deposited at the Office of the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, Belfast.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Council of the Urban District of Newry (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") intend to apply to Parliament in the ensuing Session for leave to bring in a Bill for the following or some of the following purposes, that is to say:—

Rating of Owners.

To provide that in certain cases the Owners, instead of the Occupiers, of properties may be rated to the Poor Rate, the Water Rate, and the Consolidated Town Rate.

To allow for the granting of discounts and deductions to Owners, who are rated instead of Occupiers.

To provide for the recovery of rates from Occupiers by Owners.

Closing of Street.

To provide for the closing of so much of the Street known as Lower Water Street, in the Urban District of Newry, as extends for two hundred feet or thereabouts from its junction with Hill Street to a point in an easterly direction, ending at the rear of the Cathedral of Saints Patrick and Colman, in said Urban District.

To provide for the extinguishment of all rights over said street, saving the right of the Council to enter on and open up same for the purpose of maintaining and repairing the Sewers and Mains under same.

To provide for the ownership of said Street when closed.

To provide for the expenses of Closing same.

Cost of the Act.

To provide for the payment out of the Consolidated Town Rate of the costs of the Act.

CARRICKFERGUS HARBOUR
COMMISSIONERS.

URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL OF
CARRICKFERGUS.

Transfer of the Harbour of Carrickfergus and other property of the Carrickfergus Harbour Commissioners from the Carrickfergus Harbour Commissioners to the Urban District Council of Carrickfergus.

Power to the Urban District Council of Carrickfergus to hold, maintain, work, and regulate the

Harbour of Carrickfergus—Dissolution of Carrickfergus Harbour Commissioners—Discharge of debts and liabilities of Carrickfergus Harbour Commissioners—Power to the Urban District Council of Carrickfergus to levy tolls, rates, and charges in respect of Carrickfergus Harbour and to make by-laws in respect of same and impose penalties.

Power to the Urban District Council of Carrickfergus to widen portion of the Alexandra Pier, otherwise called the West Pier, at Carrickfergus Harbour, and to make the Railways, hereinafter described, joining the Carrickfergus Harbour Junction Railway—Power to enter into Agreements as to the working and user of the said Railways—Financial provisions and borrowing powers—Provisions as to application of Revenue—Transfer of Officers—Incorporation of Acts and Orders—Miscellaneous and incidental provisions—Costs of the Bill.

NOTICE is hereby given that application is intended to be made to the Parliament of Northern Ireland in the ensuing Session by the Carrickfergus Harbour Commissioners and the Urban District Council of Carrickfergus for leave to bring in a Bill (hereinafter called "the Bill") to effect the objects and purposes following, that is to say:

(1) To transfer from the Carrickfergus Harbour Commissioners (hereinafter called "the Commissioners") and to vest in the Urban District Council of Carrickfergus (hereinafter called "the Council") the undertaking of the Carrickfergus Harbour Commissioners and the Harbour of Carrickfergus and the piers enclosing the same and all other property, rights, powers, authorities and privileges now vested in the Commissioners.

(2) To empower the Council to hold, work, use, regulate and maintain the said Harbour and Piers and other property now vested in the Commissioners—to levy tolls, rates, and charges in respect of Carrickfergus Harbour, to make by-laws in respect of same, and impose penalties—and to enjoy and exercise the said rights and powers, and to do all such other acts and things as may be necessary or expedient for the effectual working of the said Harbour.

(3) To empower the Council to widen for part of its length the Alexandra Pier, commonly called the West Pier, of Carrickfergus Harbour, such widening to commence at a point 6 yards, or thereabouts, from the north-west face of the Bight or return portion of the said Pier, and to extend thence in a straight line in a north-westerly direction for a distance of 80 yards or thereabouts, and to terminate at a point 373 yards or thereabouts from the southern boundary of Governor's Walk, in the Urban District of Carrickfergus, all of which works will be in the Urban District of Carrickfergus, Parish of Saint Nicholas, and County of Antrim.

(4) To empower the Council to make and to work, use, and maintain the following railways and works, namely:—

(a) A railway commencing at a point 5 yards or thereabouts from the north-eastern face of the existing head of the said Alexandra Pier, commonly known as the West Pier, of Carrickfergus Harbour, and terminating by a junction with the said Carrickfergus Harbour Junction Railway at the south-eastern terminus or end thereof.

(b) A railway commencing by a junction with the Carrickfergus Harbour Junction Railway at

a point 8 yards or thereabouts, measured along the Carrickfergus Harbour Junction Railway in a north-westerly direction from the south-east terminus thereof, and terminating by a junction with the Carrickfergus Harbour Junction Railway at a point 40 yards or thereabouts, measured along the Carrickfergus Harbour Junction Railway in a south-easterly direction from the south-east end of the existing weighbridge on the Carrickfergus Harbour Junction Railway.

(c) All works necessary for or incidental to the working, user, and maintenance of the said Railways and each of them.

All the said railways and works will be situated within the Urban District of Carrickfergus, Parish of Saint Nicholas, and County of Antrim.

(5) To empower the Council to enter into Agreements with any railway company, public body, company, or person as to the working and user of the said railways.

(6) To empower the Council to borrow at interest a sum or sums not exceeding £10,000 for the purpose of

(a) Repaying with interest the balance remaining due of moneys borrowed by the Commissioners from the Commissioners of Public Works in Ireland and now due to the Ministry of Finance.

(b) Paying the cost of widening the said Pier and making the said railways and works and of repairing the said Harbours and Piers, and the costs of the Bill.

(7) To empower the Council to secure by a mortgage of or charge on (a) the revenue of Carrickfergus Harbour; (b) the lands, property and houses the property of the Council, situate in the Town of Carrickfergus and in the North-East Division of the West Division and the Middle Division of Carrickfergus, all in the Parish of Saint Nicholas, and County of Antrim; and (c) the District Rate or any of them, the repayment with interest of the moneys to be borrowed by them under the powers of the Bill.

(8) To empower the Council to defray out of the income of the said lands, property, and houses, or of the investments representing the proceeds of the sale thereof, and if and so far as such income shall be insufficient for the purpose to defray out of the District Fund and rates and revenues of the Council the amount (if any) by which the income of the said Harbour and Railways may be insufficient to discharge the expenses incurred by the Council in working, using and maintaining the same and the interest on the moneys borrowed under the powers of the Bill.

(9) To make provision for the payment out of the moneys to be borrowed by the Council under the powers of the Bill of the costs, charges, and expenses of and incident to the preparing, obtaining and passing of the Bill, or otherwise, in relation thereto incurred by the Commissioners and the Council.

And Notice is hereby further given that on or before the 30th day of November, 1926, plans and sections of the said intended railways and works, together with books of reference thereto, an ordnance map with the lines of the intended railways delineated thereon, and a copy of this Notice will be deposited for public inspection with the Clerk of the Crown and Peace for the County of Antrim

NOTICE is hereby given that the Council of the Urban District of Portadown (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") intend to apply to Parliament in the ensuing Session for leave to bring in a Bill for the following or some of the following purposes, that is to say:—

Recovery of Rates.

To provide that the town rate, leviable in the Urban District, may be recovered with the poor rate, and that the remedies for the recovery of the poor rate shall apply in the case of the town rate.

Rating of Owners.

To provide that in certain cases the owners, instead of the occupiers, of properties may be rated to the town rate and the poor rate.

To provide for the granting of discounts and deductions to owners who are rated instead of occupiers.

To provide for the recovery of rates from occupiers by owners where, as between the owner and the occupier, the occupier is liable.

Costs of Act.

To provide for the payment out of the town rate of the costs of the Act.

Printed copies of the said Bill will be deposited in the Office of the Clerk of the Parliaments on or before the 17th day of December, 1926.

ANTRIM ELECTRICITY SUPPLY.

(Incorporation of Company; Supply of Electricity in parts of Counties of Antrim and Londonderry; dam and weir across River Bann and other works in Counties of Antrim and Londonderry; impounding, regulating and raising or lowering of waters of River

Bann; revocation of powers and duties of Lower Bann Navigation Trustees; revocation of powers of Belfast and North-East Ireland Electricity and Power Gas Company; Generating Station; compulsory acquisition of lands, easements, &c.; special provisions as to assessment and payment of compensation; breaking up, stopping up and interference with roads, rivers, navigations, &c.; supply of electricity to Public Utility undertakings for use outside area of supply and ancillary powers; agreements with Government Departments, Local Authorities, Companies, bodies and persons as to supply of electricity within and beyond the limits of supply and construction of works, &c.; application for and transfers of Electricity Orders; Financial and Administrative provisions; modification of Lands Clauses Acts; Exemption from and Modification of certain provisions of Electricity (Supply) Acts; Incorporation amendment repeal, &c. of Acts, Orders, &c.)

APPLICATION is intended to be made to Parliament in the forthcoming Session for leave to bring in a Bill for the following main objects or some of them:—

1. To incorporate a company (hereinafter called "the Company") for the purposes of generating using distributing and supplying electricity and developing and using water or other power for the generation of electricity and of establishing and carrying on electricity generating stations and hydraulic and other works and doing all things necessary for or ancillary to or convenient in connection with those purposes and for any other purposes of the Bill.

2. To empower the Company to supply electricity in the following area (hereinafter referred to as "the area of supply") namely:—

(a) The County of Antrim, with the exception of the City and County Borough of Belfast, of the Rural District of Belfast, of the Urban and Rural Districts of Lisburn, and of the Island of Rathlin;

(b) The Urban Districts of Coleraine and Portstewart, part of the Urban District of Portrush, the Rural District of Coleraine, and part of the Rural District of Magherafelt, in the County of Londonderry.

3. To define prescribe and regulate the powers and obligations of the Company with reference to the supply of electricity within the area of supply and the restrictions to be imposed on such powers and the terms and conditions on which electricity may or shall be supplied.

4. To empower the Company to construct and maintain the following principal works or some of them (together with all convenient and ancillary embankments, weirs, sluices, channels, roads, turbines, buildings, and other works, machinery, plant, apparatus and conveniences, whether hereinafter specified or not) namely:—

WORK No. 1.—A dam and weir extending across the River Bann and its banks above the existing Carnroe Weir at a point about 440 yards above the lock at the said weir. The said Work No. 1 will be situate partly in the townlands of Carranroe and Tamlaght in the rural district of Coleraine in the County of Londonderry, partly in the townland of Vow in the rural district of Ballymoney in the County of Antrim and partly on the bed shore and banks of the River Bann in those two districts.

WORK No. 2.—A reservoir (being an enlargement of the River Bann) to be formed

by the intended work No. 1 hereinbefore described and extending from that Work to the Southern end of the Portna Canal.

The said WORK No. 2 and works in connection therewith will be situate partly in the townlands of Carranroe, Tamlaght, Movanagher, Claragh, Kilrea, and Mcneygran; in the said rural district of Coleraine, partly in the townlands of Vow, Artiloman, Artnagross, Moore Lodge, Carney Hill, Ballymaconelly, and Culmore, in the said rural district of Ballymoney and partly on the bed shore and banks of the River Bann in those two districts.

WORK No. 3.—A road to be situate in the Townland of Vow in the said rural district of Ballymoney commencing by a junction with the main road through Vow Village at a point about 65 yards north-westwards of the Flax Mill, and terminating on the northern side of Vow Graveyard.

WORK No. 4.—An alteration of the level of the public road leading from Vow to Moore Lodge situate in the said Townland of Vow commencing and terminating at points situate respectively about 10 yards northwards and 290 yards southwards from the said Flax Mill.

WORK No. 5.—An alteration of the level of the last-mentioned public road in the Townland of Artnagross in the said rural district of Ballymoney commencing at a point situate about 100 yards north-westwards of the Lodge entrance to Glandore and terminating at about the said Lodge entrance.

WORK No. 6.—An alteration in the Townland of Movanagher in the said rural district of Coleraine of the level of the public road leading from Kilrea to Movanagher commencing and terminating at points situate respectively about 1,185 yards and 1,130 yards northwards from Bannfield.

WORK No. 7.—An alteration of the level of the public road between Kilrea and M'Laughlin's Corner commencing and terminating at points situate respectively about 375 yards westwards and 865 yards eastwards of Kilrea Bridge. The said Work No. 7 will be situate partly in the Townland of Kilrea in the said rural district of Coleraine and partly in the Townlands of Culmore and Ballymaconelly in the said rural district of Ballymoney.

WORK No. 8.—An alteration in the Townland of Culmore in the said rural district of Ballymoney of the level of the public road leading from Doneysheil Farm to the said road between Kilrea and M'Laughlin's Corner commencing at the last mentioned road and terminating at the northern end of the said Farm.

5. To empower the Company to acquire compulsorily or by agreement and to hold and use for the purposes of the intended works hereinbefore described and other purposes of the Bill lands buildings waters and other property and easements or rights in under or over lands and waters in the townlands and other places hereinbefore mentioned and also to acquire compulsorily or by agreement and to hold and use for the deposit of soil and other materials and for other purposes of the Bill and also for the purposes hereinafter mentioned in this paragraph the following lands (namely):—

(a) A strip of land in the Townlands of Carranroe and Tamlaght in the rural district of Coleraine in the County of Londonderry extending in a south-westerly direction from the plot of land (b) next hereinafter described to the road leading from Kilrea to Coleraine and having a width of about 130 yards.

(b) A plot of land situate on the left bank of the River Bann in the said Townlands of Carranroe and Tamlaght and extending along that river from a point about 250 yards southwards of the boundary between the said townlands to a point about 40 yards northwards of the existing Carnroe Weir and having an average width of about 170 yards.

(c) A plot of land situate on the right bank of the River Bann in the Townland of Vow in the rural district of Ballymoney in the County of Antrim extending along that river between points situate respectively about 150 yards northwards and 600 yards southwards of the southern gates of the existing Carnroe Lock and having a width varying from about 150 yards to about 700 yards.

And to empower the Company (in addition to the purposes hereinbefore mentioned in this paragraph) to use the Lands hereinbefore described for the purpose of providing means of access to the intended works hereinbefore described and to construct erect lay down maintain and use roads approaches conduits cables electric lines wires and other apparatus and works on under or over those lands; and also to use the lands (b) and (c) hereinbefore described for the purposes mentioned in the next succeeding paragraph of this notice.

6. To empower the Company to construct and maintain a power house and station for generating and transforming electricity with all necessary machinery works and conveniences, and to generate and transform electricity and produce manufacture convert and work up any material product or thing arising or used in such generation or transformation, on the following work and lands, namely:—

The intended dam and weir (No. 1) hereinbefore described and the lands (b) and (c) described in the immediately preceding paragraph of this Notice.

7. To make special provisions as to the settlement of the compensation payable for any lands, easements and rights or interests in lands and waters and fisheries and other property to be acquired by the Company under the powers of the intended Act and to provide in certain cases for a supply of electricity in satisfaction for any claims for compensation or otherwise.

8. To empower the Company:—

(a) To deviate in the construction of the intended works from the lines and levels shown upon the plans and sections to be deposited as hereinafter mentioned.

(b) To impound, hold up, abstract, divert, appropriate and use, and to regulate the flow of water from or in the River Bann, Lough Beg, Lough Neagh, the Lower Bann Navigation, and any other streams cuts or navigations flowing into or communicating with such river loughs navigations or canals and to discharge water into any rivers, streams or watercourses.

(c) to deepen, dredge, widen; alter and improve the bed banks and shore of the said river and navigations.

(d) to open, break up, alter, divert and stop up and construct lay down and erect works in under and over public and private roads, highways, footpaths, bridges, loughs, rivers, streams, navigations, railways, tramways, and other works and apparatus within the area of supply and in particular to stop up (i) so much of the public road leading through Movanager Village as is situate within the limits of deviation of the reservoir (Work No. 2) and (ii) so much of the public road in the Townland of Tamlaght leading from Four Bushes past Antrim View House to the River Bann as is situate between that house and that river.

(e) To exercise all such other powers as may be convenient or ancillary to the generation distribution and supply of electricity, the utilisation of hydraulic power and the carrying out of the objects and purposes of the intended Act.

9. To empower the Company to apply for Orders under the Electricity (Supply) Acts 1882 to 1919 authorising the distribution of electricity in any area in or adjoining the area of supply and to acquire by transfer or otherwise any such Orders already granted or to be granted to any other company authority or person and the undertakings authorised by such Orders and to empower any such last mentioned company authority or person to transfer to the Company any such undertaking belonging to them and any of their powers rights and privileges.

10. To authorise the Company on the one hand and any authority company body or person authorised to supply electricity in any area whether within or beyond the area of supply on the other hand, to enter into and carry into effect agreements for the supply to one another of electricity in bulk or otherwise and of plant fittings and materials and the exercise by any party to any such agreement of any powers or rights of any other party with reference to the construction of works, and the supply or user of electricity and to authorise any company body or person owning or working any public utility undertaking to use electricity supplied by the Company for any purposes of such undertaking whether within or beyond the area of supply and to authorise the Company in connection with the supply of electricity to such undertakings to exercise powers and to acquire way leaves and rights for the purposes of such supply.

11. To authorise the Company and any owners, lessees or other persons interested in any lands, waters, fisheries or other property which may be acquired or used under the powers of the Bill and any Government Department, county, local or public authority, Conservancy or Navigation authority or body and any public or other company body or person to enter into and carry into effect contracts and agreements for and with respect to the acquisition and user of such lands, waters, fisheries and other property and easements or rights in over and under lands or waters, the construction and maintenance of any works to be authorised by the Bill and the exercise of any powers of the Bill and the supply of electricity by or two the Company to or by any other parties to any such contract or agreement and to make all necessary or expedient financial or other arrangements for or in connection with any of the matters aforesaid (including the advancing or giving of monies to the Company) upon such

terms and conditions as may be agreed or prescribed by or determined under the provisions of the intended Act and to confer all necessary powers in that behalf on any such owners, lessees, Government Department, authority, company, body or person and to confirm and make binding on the parties thereto any such agreement which may have been or be entered into.

12. To repeal revoke and extinguish all rights powers privileges obligations and duties of the Lower Bann Navigation Trustees for and with respect to the Lower Bann Navigation whether under any Act of Parliament or Award of the Commissioners of Public Works or otherwise so far as is necessary for the purposes of the intended Act.

13. To repeal the powers to supply electricity in the Counties of Londonderry and Antrim of the Belfast and North-East Ireland Electricity and Power Gas Company.

14. To make provision as to the capital and borrowing powers of the Company and the management and conduct of their affairs and to enact other financial and administrative provisions.

15. To authorise the Company to exercise the powers of or to exempt the Company wholly or partly from all or some of the provisions of the Electricity (Supply) Acts 1882 to 1919, Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act 1899, Lands Clauses Acts, Companies Trustees Acts, Waterworks Clauses Acts 1847 to 1863 and Railways Clauses Consolidation Act 1845.

16. To confer on the Company all such powers as may be necessary or useful for the carrying out of the purposes for which the Company is established or as may be incidental thereto or which it may be convenient to exercise in conjunction with the generation and supply of electricity and the use of hydraulic or other power for the purposes of such generation and to vary alter or extinguish all rights and privileges which may interfere with the objects of the Bill and to confer all other rights and privileges necessary for carrying such objects into effect.

17. To make provision for the protection of the telegraphic lines of His Majesty's Postmaster-General.

18. To make provision for the protection of the Honourable the Irish Society and the lessees and tenants of the Society's fisheries.

19. To make provision for the protection of the owners of the eel and salmon fisheries in the River Bann and their lessees.

20. To make provision with reference to the future purchase by the Ministry of Commerce or any other Government Department of the undertaking and powers to be authorised by the Bill or of any part thereof.

The Bill will or may amend or repeal the Act 19 and 20 Vict., cap. lxii, and any other Acts or any Orders relating to the Lower Bann Navigation Trustees. It will or may also amend or repeal the Act 4 Edw. 7, cap. ccxxviii and the Act and will vary and extinguish all rights and privileges which would interfere with any of its objects and confer other rights and privileges.

The work will commence at a point on the South-West bank of the River about low water line 1 furlong or thereabouts South-Eastward of the outer or riverward end of the said existing Timber Jetty carrying the lights on the West or left bank of the River, and will extend therefrom in a North-Westerly and North North Westerly or seaward direction for a distance of 3½ furlongs or thereabouts and there terminate.

2. To empower the Commissioners to acquire compulsorily or by Agreement—

(a) Certain lands containing an area of 25 acres statute measure or thereabouts situated on the Western or left bank and foreshore and bed of the River at the mouth of the River Bann in or abutting on the Townland of Ballywoolen, Parish of Dunboe, Barony of Coleraine, in the Rural District of Coleraine, and County of Londonderry and bounded on the North and North-East by the waters and part of the bed of the River Bann, on the North-West by the existing West Pier, on the East by part of the bed of the River Bann and on the South-West by the sandhills and lands in the occupation of the Castlerock Golf Club and on the South-East by a line running due South from a point on low water line on West bank of River, 20 chains or thereabouts measured in a South-Easterly or upstream direction from the outermost or riverward end of the said existing Timber Jetty on the West side of the River carrying the lights.

6. To exempt the Commissioners from the provisions of the Lands Clauses Acts with respect to the sale of superfluous lands and to authorise the Commissioners to hold or sell, lease exchange or otherwise dispose of to such persons and at such times as they may think fit any lands acquired by them under the powers of the intended Act or otherwise vested in them.

7. To enable the Commissioners to Raise Moneys on the Credit of the River Bann Fund and of the Tolls, Rates and Charges and revenue which they may derive or acquire under the intended Act and the Acts relating to the

said Navigation and the Coleraine Harbour.

8.
