The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that they have made an Order under Sections 1, 2, 3 and 13 of the Import Duties Act 1958 entitled The Import Duties (General) (No. 1) Order, 1973.

This Order, which came into operation on 1st February, 1973, further amends the Import Duties (General) (No. 7) Order 1971, which sets out the United Kingdom Customs Tariff and the protective import duties chargeable in accordance with it.

This Order (Schedule 1) amends the manner in which headings 17.04, 18.06, 19.07, 19.08, 21.01 and 21.07 of the United Kingdom Tariff are at present subdivided in order to comply with the provisions of Article 47 of the Act annexed to the Treaty of Accession to the European Economic Community. It also provides for some changes

in import duties in those headings where the elimination of present tariff subdivisions has been necessary, the rates being those prescribed by an E.E.C. Regulation made under the provisions of paragraph 5 of Article 47. Nevertheless, E.F.T.A. tariff treatment is maintained in cases in which it has hitherto applied in those headings (Schedule 3).

The Order (Schedule 2) also provides for the inclusion of certain Chapter Notes relating to the subheadings of the headings amended by it.

The Order came into operation on 1st February, 1973, and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1973 No. 144

Proposed Loughbrickland By-Pass

 - a road on the western side of the new trunk road connecting to that road, to the existing trunk road and to the Poyntzpass Road (C344).
- III. to stop-up wholly certain junctions which will exist between:
 - parts of the existing trunk road and the new trunk road:
 - the new trunk road and the Rathfriland Road b. (B3):
 - the new trunk road, the existing trunk road and the Poyntzpass Road (C344);
 - the existing trunk road and some of the roads to be constructed under Part II above.
