MINISTRY OF DEVELOPMENT

ROADS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1948

The Ministry of Development hereby gives notice that it has been requested by Tyrone County Council to make an Order under Section 17 of the Roads Act (Northern Ireland) 1948, the effect of which would be to authorise the abandonment of a length of approximately 720 linear yards of Unclassified Road No. 1989 leading to Campbell's house in the townland of Bradkeel.

The length of road proposed to be abandoned is more particularly delineated and coloured red on Map No. 4022/112, a copy of which, together with a copy of the draft Order, may be inspected free of charge at all reasonable hours during the period from 14th September to 23rd October, 1973, at the Ministry of Development, Room 413, Stormont, Belfast BT4 3SS, or the Offices of Tyrone County Council, Mountjoy Road, Omagh.

THE BELFAST—NEWCASTLE TRUNK ROAD T2

(Millbridge—Castlenavan)

The Ministry of Development hereby gives notice in accordance with the provisions of the First Schedule to the Roads Act (Northern Ireland) 1948 that it proposes to make an Order under Sections 1 and 3 of the Act directing that:

1. a length of new road to be constructed in the townlands of Ballymaglave South, Magheradrool, Magheratimpany, Drumaness and Tievendarragh, from a point on the trunk road about 260 yards north of its junction with the unclassified road DR51 (Ballymaglave Road) and extending in a generally southerly direction for approximately 3.3 miles to a point on the trunk road about 247 yards south of its junction with the unclassified road DR132 (Tannaghmore Road) shall become part of the trunk road (T2); and
2. approximately 3.1 miles of the present trunk road which will be superseded by the length of new road shall, from 1st April next after the date on which the new road is opened to through traffic, cease to be part of the trunk road.

The proposed Order will also authorise the Ministry:

- (i) to construct the following roads:
 - (a) a road to connect the unclassified road DR51 (Ballymaglave Road) to the western side of the new road;
 - (b) a road just south of the road mentioned at (i) (a) to connect the present trunk road to the eastern side of the new road;
 - (c) a road in the townland of Drumaness part of which will be constructed along the line of the third-class road C291 (Drumsnade Road) to connect the present trunk road to the eastern side of the new road;
- (ii) to stop-up wholly the following junctions:
 - (a) the two junctions at the northern end of the new road in the townland of Ballymaglave South which will exist between the present trunk road and the western side of the new road;
 - (b) the junction at the northern end of the new road in the townland of Ballymaglave South which will exist between the present trunk road and the eastern side of the new road;

- (c) the junction which will exist between the unclassified road DR51 (Ballymaglave Road) and the western side of the new road;
 - (d) four junctions in the townland of Drumaness which will exist between the present trunk road and the western and eastern sides of the new road;
 - (e) the junction in the townland of Tievendarragh at the southern end of the new road which will exist between the present trunk road and the eastern side of the new road;
- (iii) to stop-up to vehicular traffic the junction which will exist between the eastern side of the new road and the third-class road C291 (Drumsnade Road); and
 - (iv) to improve the junctions which will exist between:
 - (a) the western side of the new road and the third-class road C291 (Drumsnade Road);
 - (b) the western side of the new road and the unclassified road DR132 (Tannaghmore Road).

The proposals are delineated on two maps which, together with a copy of the draft Order, may be inspected by any person at all reasonable hours during the period from 14th September, 1973, to 22nd October, 1973, at the offices of the Secretary, Down County Council, Courthouse, Downpatrick, or of the Ministry (Room 412), Stormont, Belfast BT4 3SS.

Any person may, within the said period, object to the making of the Order by written notice to the Ministry stating the grounds of objection.
