NOTICE is hereby given that the Minister of Home Affairs, with the concurrence of the Minister of Finance, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Constabulary Act (Northern Ireland), 1922, and of all other powers the Minister thereunto enabling, has made an Order dated the 1st day of February, 1927, entitled "The Royal Ulster Constabulary Allowances (Amending) Order, 1927" (Statutory Rules and Orders of Northern Ireland, 1927, No. 16).

The Civil Service Commissioners for Northern Ireland hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Ministry of Finance for Northern Ireland, and are in substitution for those published on the 1st April, 1927.

Regulations respecting Open Competitions for the situation of Clerk (Male) in the Civil Service.

1. The limits of age are 17 and 19. If a competition begins in one of the first six months of any year, candidates must be of or over the age of 17 and under the age of 19 on the 31st day of March in that year. If a competition begins in one of

the last six months of any year, candidates must be of or over the age of 17 and under the age of 19 on the 30th day of September in that year.

2. A candidate must be a natural-born British subject, and the son of a father also a natural-born British subject.

3. Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the Ministry of Finance has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

4. A fee of £1 will be required from each candidate applying to enter the competition.

5. The competition will comprise the following :
