DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES

Notice is hereby given that the Department of Health and Social Services, in exercise of powers conferred by Section 103 of the National Insurance Act (Northern Ireland) 1966 (having been determined by the Department of Finance to be the appropriate department for the purposes of that section to make regulations modifying the scheme for the provision of pensions and other benefits established by regulations made under Section 67 of and Schedule 8 to the Health Services Act (Northern Ireland) 1971) and in exercise of powers conferred by Articles 12 and 14 of the Superannuation (Northern Ireland) Order 1972 and of any other powers enabling it in that behalf, after consulting representatives of persons likely to be affected by these regulations, and with the consent of the Department of Finance, has made regulations entitled the Health Services (Superannuation) (Amendment) (No. 2) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1974 (S.R. 1974, No. 248). The regulations which were made on 2nd October, 1974, came into operation on 8th November, 1974.

They amend the Health Services (Superannuation) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1962, which provide for the superannuation of persons engaged in the Health Services.

THE IMPORTED FOOD (NORTHERN IRELAND) REGULATIONS 1968

United States of America: Official Certificate

The Department of Health and Social Services with the approval of the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food gives notice that in exercise of the powers conferred on it by the Imported Food (Northern Ireland) Regulations 1968 it hereby recognises, subject to the conditions hereinafter set out, the Official Certificates of which particulars are given in the Schedule hereto as showing:

- that the meat to which they relate or the meat from which the meat product to which they relate was prepared, was derived from mammals inspected before and after death in the country of origin of the meat and passed in accordance with criteria satisfactory to the Department and
- that the dressing, packing and other preparation of the meat or the meat product was carried out with all necessary precautions for the prevention of danger to health.

The said Certificates are recognised subject to the following conditions:

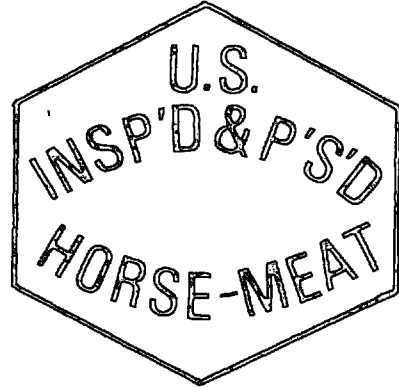
- Where the Official Certificates are in the form of labels, the recognition will apply only if the labels are securely affixed to the meat or the meat product or the package containing the meat or the meat product, and if the labels have not in any other circumstances or on any other occasion been used as Official Certificates.

- Where the Official Certificates are in the form of stamps, the recognition will apply only if the stamps are clearly impressed or otherwise marked on the meat or the meat product or the package containing the meat or the meat product.

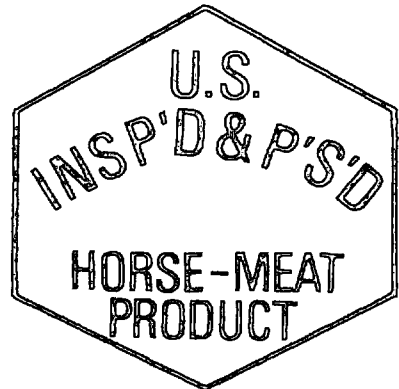
- Recognition of the Official Certificate is restricted to those completed by the insertion of one of the establishment numbers currently approved by the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food.

The Certificates will be completed by the insertion of the establishment number.

NOTE:
