MEDICINES ACT 1968

Approved Names 1973

The Secretaries of State respectively concerned with health in England, in Scotland, and in Wales, and the Secretary of State of Northern Ireland, acting jointly, have, on the recommendation of the Medicines Commission and in accordance with section 100 (2) of the Medicines Act 1968, caused to be published a supplementary list of names and that this list shall take effect on the 1st June, 1975.

REDEMPTION AND CONVERSION OF 7% ULSTER DEVELOPMENT BONDS

The Department of Finance gives notice that 7% Ulster Development Bonds purchased in the period 2nd April, 1970, to 1st October, 1970, will be repayable upon application by the holders at the rate of £102.00 for each £100.00 of Bonds on the maturity date, viz. 1st October, 1975, unless the holders accept an offer of conversion into 9½% Ulster Development Bonds (First Conversion Issue), which security has been created by an Order dated 4th April, 1974, made by the Department of Finance under Section 11 of the Exchequer and Financial Provisions Act (Northern Ireland) 1950. Interest on 7% Ulster Development Bonds will not be paid in respect of periods after the maturity date.

Holders of Bonds concerned will be invited to exchange their holdings, in whole or in part, in multiples of £5, into 9½% Ulster Development Bonds (First Conversion Issue) on 1st October, 1975, at the rate of £5 of such Bonds for each £5 of Bonds tendered for exchange.

Holders of maturing Bonds who decide not to accept the conversion offer should apply for repayment. No interest will be payable on the Bonds after they mature on 1st October, 1975, and they can only be repaid upon application by the holders.

The full conversion terms will be set out in a Prospectus and Notice which will be sent to holders, or in the case of joint holdings to the first named holder, on 1st June, 1975, together with a form of request for conversion and a form of application for repayment for use if holders do not wish to convert. Holders should signify their intentions by completing the appropriate form and returning it with the Bond Book(s) to the Department of Finance, Ulster Development Bonds Branch, Crown Buildings, Coleraine, Co. Londonderry.

Any holder who does not receive these forms, with the Prospectus and Notice, within a reasonable time after 1st June, 1975, should report the fact to the Department of Finance.

Holders who accept an offer of conversion will receive on 1st October, 1975, the final interest payment on the matured Bonds for the period 1st April, 1975, to 30th September, 1975, together with the maturity premium on the Bonds exchanged.

The list of acceptances of the conversion offer will be closed on 1st July, 1975.
