GAME PRESERVATION ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1928

GAME LAW AMENDMENT ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1951

Notice is hereby given that the Department proposes to make an Order under the above-mentioned Acts—

1. prohibiting the sale or purchase of grouse for consumption in Northern Ireland or elsewhere at any time from 11th August, 1975, to 11th August, 1976;
2. prohibiting the shooting or taking of partridge at any time from 30th September, 1975, to 30th September, 1976;
3. prohibiting the killing of hen pheasants at any time from 30th September, 1975, to 30th September, 1976, except where exemption is granted by him;
4. prohibiting the sale or purchase of hen pheasants for consumption in Northern Ireland or elsewhere at any time from 30th September, 1975, to 30th September, 1976, except hen pheasants killed by a person exempted under paragraph 3, which may be sold to a licensed game dealer.

Any person objecting to any of these proposals should do so in writing to the Department at Stormont, Belfast BT4 3SS, not later than 30th June, 1975.
