# WIDOWS', ORPHANS' AND OLD AGE CONTRIBUTORY PENSIONS ACT, (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1925.

The Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland hereby gives notice that Regulations have been made under the proviso to sub-section (1) of Section 28, and sub-section (1) of Section 30 of the Widows', Orphans' and Old Age Contributory Pensions Act (Northern Ireland), 1925, consolidating the existing Regulations and prescribing the Claims and Payment procedure for Pensions payable to persons between the age of 65 and 70 as from the 2nd January, 1928.

# THE LEAD PAINT (PROTECTION AGAINST POISONING) ACT, NORTHERN (IRELAND), 1927.

NOTICE is hereby given in pursuance of Section 80 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, that the Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland proposes to make Regulations under Section 1 of the Lead Paint (Protection against Poisoning) Act (Northern Ireland), 1927, for preventing danger from lead paint to persons employed in or in connection with the painting of buildings.

THE SAFEGUARDING OF INDUSTRIES (EXEMPTION) No. 4 ORDER, 1927, DATED 4th OCTOBER, 1927, MADE BY THE TREASURY UNDER SECTION 10 OF THE FINANCE ACT. 1995 (10 AND OF THE FINANCE ACT, 1926 (16 AND 17 GEO. 5, c. 22).

WHEREAS it is provided by sub-section (5) of Section 10 of the Finance Act, 1926 (16 and 17 Geo. 5, c. 22), that the Treasury may by Order exempt from the duty imposed by Section one of the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921 (11 and 12 Geo. 5, c. 47), as amended by the Finance Act, 1926, for such period as may be specified in the Order, any article in respect of which the Paced of June article in respect of which the Board of Trade are satisfied on a representation made by a consumer of that article, that the article is not made in any part of His Majesty's Dominions in quantities which are substantial, having regard to the consumption of that article for the time being in the United Kingdom, and that there is no reasonable probability that the article will within a reasonable period be made in His Majesty's Dominions in such substantial quantities :

And whereas the Board of Trade are satisfied on representations made by consumers of the articles specified in the Schedule to this Order that those articles are not made in any part of His Majesty's Dominions in quantities which are substantial, having regard to the consumption of those articles for the time being in the United Kingdom, and that there is no reasonable probability that those articles will within a reasonable period be made in His Majesty's Dominions in such substantial quantities:

Now therefore we, being two of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in pursuance of the powers conferred on us by the said Section 10 of the Finance Act, 1926, and of all other powers enabling us in that behalf, hereby order as follows:

1. Such of the articles mentioned in the Schedule to this Order as are not entered under the Customs Acts before the Eighth day of October, 1927, or which have not been removed from a bonded warehouse before that date, shall be exempt from the duty imposed by Section one of the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921, as amended by the Finance Act, 1926, for a period ending on the 6th day of March, 1928.

2. This Order may be cited as the Safeguard-ing of Industries (Exemption) No. 4 Order, 1927.
