

GERMAN REPARATION RECOVERY
(No. 1) ORDER, 1922,

DATED 16th FEBRUARY, 1922, MADE BY
BOARD OF TRADE.

THE Board of Trade in pursuance of the Powers conferred upon them by Section 5 of the German Reparation (Recovery) Act, 1921, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf upon the recommendation of a Committee constituted under Section 5 of the said Act, hereby make the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the GERMAN REPARATION RECOVERY (No. 1) ORDER, 1922.

2. Any Article of the following description shall be exempt from the provisions of the said Act, that is to say, any Article being a publication in the German Language which is proved to the satisfaction of the Commissioners of Customs and Excise to be a periodical publication of a German learned Society, or other Scientific or Philosophical periodical publication.

GERMAN REPARATION RECOVERY
(No. 2) ORDER, 1922,

DATED 16th FEBRUARY, 1922, MADE BY
THE BOARD OF TRADE.

THE Board of Trade, in pursuance of the Powers conferred upon them by Section 5 of the German Reparation (Recovery) Act, 1921, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf upon the recommendation of a Committee constituted under Section 5 of the said Act, hereby make the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the GERMAN REPARATION RECOVERY (No. 2) ORDER, 1922.

2. Any Article of the following description shall be exempt from the provisions of the said Act, that is to say, any Article in respect of which it is proved to the satisfaction of the Commissioners of Customs and Excise

(a) that such Article is imported into the United Kingdom for the purpose of there undergoing any process of manufacture and thereafter being re-exported to Germany;

(b) that such Article is consigned from Germany direct to the manufacturer in the United Kingdom by whom the said process is to be carried out;

(c) that such Article does not pass into the ownership of any person in the United Kingdom and that no payment in respect of it is made to Germany; and in respect of which security has been given by the manufacturer to the satisfaction of the said Commissioners that such Article will be returned to Germany within a period of one month after the date of the completion of the said process.
