THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the Forestry (Consultative Committees) Order, 1920, His Majesty was pleased, in pursuance of section six of the Forestry Act, 1919, to establish Consultative committees for giving to the Forestry Commissioners advice and assistance with respect to the exercise and performance by the said Commissioners of their powers and duties under the said Act:

And whereas by Article 3 of the said Order provision was made for regulating the travelling expenses of members attending meetings of the said committees:

And whereas it is inexpedient that the said travelling expenses should be regulated by the said Order:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, in pursuance of the said Act and by virtue of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:-

1. Article 3 of the Forestry (Consultative Committees) Order, 1920 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order"), is hereby revoked.

2. This Order may be cited as the Forestry (Consultative Committees) Order, 1928, and this Order and the principal Order may be cited together as the Forestry (Consultative Committees) Orders, 1920, and 1928.
