BALLYMENA AND DISTRICT ELECTRICITY SPECIAL ORDER, 1928.

NOTICE is hereby given that it is intended to make an application to the Electricity Commissioners for Northern Ireland for a Special Order, under Section 26 of the Electricity (Supply) Act, 1919, to authorise the sale and distribution of electricity by the Larne Electric Light and Power Co., Ltd., having a registered office at 7 Donegall Square West, in the City of Belfast, in respect of the Urban District of Ballymena, the Townlands of Broughshane Upper, Broughshane Lower, and portions of the Townlands of Tullymore, Knockboy, Kinbally, Ballygarvey, Drumfane, and Bottom, within the Rural District of Ballymena, all in the County of Antrim; and that it is proposed that overhead or other electric lines and works shall be placed in the streets and roads named in the first part of the Schedule hereto within a period of Two years; and that it is proposed to take Special powers to break up the roads and streets not repairable by the Local Authority named in the Second part of the Schedule hereto; and that for the purpose of affording such supply of electricity it is proposed to take Special Powers to break up the roads and streets within the area of Larne Rural District Council and Ballymena Rural District Council named in the Third part of the Schedule hereto.

And Notice is hereby further given that every Local or other Public Authority, Company or person being desirous of bringing before the

Electricity Commissioners any objection respecting the Application may do so by registered letter, addressed to the Secretary of the said Commissioners, at 13 Wellington Place, Belfast, within 30 days from the date of the publication of this advertisement, and that a copy of such objection must also within the time aforesaid be forwarded to the undersigned, Solicitor for the said Order.
