INTOXICATING LIQUOR.

The Ministry of Finance hereby gives Notice that Regulations entitled "The Licensing Valuation (Regulations), 1928," providing for the giving, revision and cancellation of certificates by the Commissioner of Valuation for the purpose of Section 2 of the Finance Act (Northern Ireland), 1928, which relates to the assessment of licence duty in the case of premises structurally separated under the Intoxicating Liquor Act (Northern Ireland), 1923, have been made under the powers conferred on the Ministry by Sub-section (2) of Section 2 of the said Finance Act (Northern Ireland), 1928.

GOVERNMENT CHEMIST.

REGULATIONS made by the Ministry of Finance for Northern Ireland under Sub-Section (3) of Section 2 of the Administrative Provisions Act (Northern Ireland), 1928.

WHEREAS the Minister of Finance has in pursuance of the provisions of Section 2 of the Administrative Provisions Act (Northern Ireland), 1928, appointed the Government Chemist at the Government Laboratory for Great Britain, situated in London, to be the Government Chemist for Northern Ireland:

And Whereas it is provided by the said section of the said Act that for the purpose of giving effect thereto the Ministry of Finance (hereinafter referred to as the Ministry) after consultation with the Ministries of Home Affairs and Agriculture shall make such Regulations as are necessary:

NOW the Ministry after such consultation as aforesaid hereby makes the following Regulations:—

1. Where under the provisions of any Act any article of food, drug, or other substance is to be sent or may be sent by the Justices, Court of Law, Department of the Government, or otherwise, to the Government Chemist, it shall be sent to the Government Chemist at the Government Laboratory for Great Britain, situated in London.
2. Notice of the appointment of the Government Chemist, and of the place to which articles are to be sent, as aforesaid, shall be deemed to be duly given by the publication of these Regulations in the "Belfast Gazette."
3. Such fees as may be payable to the Government Chemist in respect of the analysis of any article shall be retained by him.
4. These Regulations may be cited as the Government Chemist Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1928.
