### NORTHERN IRELAND COURT SERVICE

Notice is hereby given that the Northern Ireland Supreme Court Rules Committee, with the concurrence of the Lord Chancellor, in pursuance of section 55 of the Judicature (Northern Ireland) Act 1978, has made a Statutory Rule entitled the Rules of the Supreme Court (Northern Ireland) (Amendment No. 2) 1981 (SR 1981 No 224). These rules which come into operation on 1st September 1981 amend the Rules of the Supreme Court (Northern Ireland) 1980 so as:

- (1) to correct some minor mistakes, omissions and printers' errors (rule 1(2) and (3), rules 4 and 5, and rules 8 to 12);
- (2) to provide a definition of "Long Vacation" (rule 2(1));
- (3) to clarify the provisions about the issue of originating summonses (rule 3);
- (4) to substitute a reference to the Legal Aid, Advice and Assistance (Northern Ireland) Order 1981, which repeals the Legal Aid and Advice Act (Northern Ireland) 1965 (rule 6);
- (5) to apply to affidavits the rules in Order 65 for the service of documents (rule 7);
- (6) to alter the list of companies approved for giving sureties (rule 13);
- (7) to substitute references to the provisions of the Judgments Enforcement (Northern Ireland) Order 1981, for references to the provisions of the Judgments (Enforcement) Act (Northern Ireland) 1969 where they appear in the Rules (rule 14).

## POST OFFICE SCHEME T5/1981

NOTE: The Scheme which follows this Note has been made under section 28 of the Post Office Act 1969 and will come into operation on 1st August 1981. THE POST OFFICE TELECOMMUNICATION AMENDMENT  
(NO. 15) SCHEME

Made ..... 31st July, 1981  
Coming into operation ..... 1st August, 1981

The Post Office, by virtue of the powers conferred upon it by section 28 of the Post Office Act 1969, and of all other powers enabling it in this behalf, hereby makes the following Scheme:

## Commencement and Citation

1. This Scheme shall come into operation on the 1st August 1981 and may be cited as the Post Office Telecommunication Amendment (No. 15) Scheme 1981.

## Interpretation

2.—(1) This Scheme shall be read as one with the Post Office Telecommunication Scheme 1976 (Post Office Scheme T1/1976) (hereinafter called 'the principal Scheme') as amended by the Post Office Telecommunication Amendment (No. 1) Scheme 1976 (Post Office Scheme T2/1976), the Post Office Telecommunication Amendment (No. 2A) Scheme 1977 (Post Office Scheme T1A/1977), the Post Office Telecommunication Amendment (No. 3) Scheme 1978 (Post Office Scheme T1/1978), the Post Office Telecommunication Amendment (No. 4) Scheme 1978 (Post Office Scheme T2/1978), the Post Office Telecommunication Amendment (No. 5) Scheme 1979 (Post Office Scheme T1/1979), the Post Office Telecommunication Amendment (No. 6) Scheme 1979 (Post Office Scheme T2/1979), the Post Office Telecommunication Amendment (No. 7) Scheme 1980 (Post Office Scheme T1/1980), the Post Office Telecommunication Amendment (No. 8) Scheme 1980 (Post Office Scheme T3/1980), the Post Office Telecommunication Amendment (No. 9) Scheme 1980 (Post Office Scheme T4/1980), the Post Office Telecommunication Amendment (No. 10) Scheme 1980 (Post Office Scheme T5/1980), the Post Office Telecommunication Amendment (No. 11) Scheme 1980 (Post Office Scheme T6/1980), the Post Office Telecommunication Amendment (No. 12) Scheme 1981 (Post Office Scheme T1/1981), the Post Office Telecommunication Amendment (No. 13) Scheme 1981 (Post Office Scheme T3/1981) and the Post Office Telecommunication Amendment (No. 14) Scheme 1981 (Post Office Scheme T4/1981).

(2) The Interpretation Act 1978 applies for the interpretation of this Scheme as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
