WIRELESS TELEGRAPHY ACT 1949

To all Holders of Amateur (A) Licences and Amateur (B) Licences

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice that, as from 1st October 1982, all licences as amended from time to time of the above types shall be and are hereby varied by the following:

18,068-18,168 kHz and 24,890-24,990 kHz

1. Two new frequency bands at 18 and 24MHz are added to the existing amateur allocation for Class A licensees. Until amateur primary status is achieved (not later than 1st July 1989) the amateur service shall operate on a non-interference basis.

2. For 18 and 24 MHz operation, the maximum power supplied to the antenna shall not exceed 10 dBW. Additional restrictions which shall apply are given in a new Footnote which is added to the Schedule as Footnote 19 as follows:

19. This band is available to the amateur service on a non-interference basis to all other services operating in conformity with the Telecommunication Convention and the International Radio Regulations. The following restrictions shall apply:

- (i) The class of emission shall be limited to continuous wave morse telegraphy by on/off keying of the carrier (A1A).
- (ii) Maximum antenna gain in any direction of radiation shall not be greater than 0 dB with respect to a half wave dipole.
- (iii) The antenna shall be horizontally polarised.

2300-2450 MHz

3. The sub-band 2300-2310 MHz will no longer be available to the amateur service.

Bands above 40 GHz

4. Four new frequency bands which are allocated to the amateur and amateur satellite service on a primary world-wide basis, are added to the existing amateur allocation as follows: 47-47.2 GHz; 75.5-76 GHz; 142-144 GHz and 248-250 GHz. The power, classes of emission and safety precautions shall be as for other bands above 1 GHz. For pulse modulation, Footnotes 5, 12, 17 and 18 shall apply;

for all other forms of modulation, Footnotes 10, 12, 17 and 18 shall apply.

THE PETROLEUM (PRODUCTION) REGULATIONS
1982

1. The Secretary of State for Energy is prepared to receive applications in accordance with the Petroleum (Production) Regulations 1982 (SI 1982 No. 1000) for petroleum production licences in respect of the blocks to which the numbers specified in Schedules I and II to this Notice have been assigned on a map deposited in the Library at the Department of Energy, Thames House South, Millbank, London SW1P 4QJ. The map may be inspected by prior appointment (Telephone No. 01 211 3394) between 0915 and 1645 hours Monday to Friday until 31 December 1982. Copies of the map may also be inspected by prior appointment at the offices of the Off-Shore Supplies Office of the Department of Energy, Alhambra House, 45 Waterloo Street, Glasgow G26AS (Telephone No. 041 221 8777 Ext. 235) and Greyfriars House, Gallowgate, Aberdeen AB9 2ZV (Telephone No. 0224 636411). Copies of material referred to in the text of this Notice as being available from the Department of Energy may be obtained from Petroleum Production Division, Department of Energy, Room 1124, Thames House South, Millbank, London SW1P 4QJ (Telephone No. 01 211 4604/3557).

Consideration and conditions of licences

2. In addition to a royalty (described in Clauses 7 to 10 of Schedule 5 of the Petroleum (Production) Regulations 1982) at the rate of 12½%, the consideration required for production licences granted as a result of this invitation will be:

(i) in respect of all blocks listed in the Schedules:

(a) at the time the offer of a licence is accepted an initial payment of £300 for each square kilometre comprised in the licensed area;

(b) on the sixth anniversary of the date of commencement of the licence term (and on exercise of the option to continue as to the remaining period of the licence) the sum of £360 for each square kilometre in the continuing part; on the seventh anniversary £720 and similarly rising by annual increments of £360 until an annual sum of £5,400 will be payable for each square kilometre comprised in the licensed area;

(ii) in respect only of blocks listed in Schedule II, an additional initial payment for each such block (payable at the time and in the manner set out in paragraphs 11 to 15 below).

3. Licensees will be required, on the day the licence is granted, to enter into an Agreement under seal with the Secretary of State and the British National Oil Corporation (BNOC) which will provide that BNOC will, if the Secretary of State so wishes, have the option to take at market price up to 51% of the petroleum (other than natural gas) produced from the licensed area. The percentage will be calculated after taking into account any petroleum required to be delivered to the Secretary of State as royalty in kind. The Agreement (excluding the Schedules referred to therein) will be in the form of Schedule III to this Notice and will provide that in specified circumstances the licensee, if so requested by the Secretary of State, will:

(i) execute a Deed of Assignment assigning the licence from the Licensee to the Licensee and BNOC jointly; and will

(ii) enter into a further agreement containing provisions under which BNOC will take the petroleum. The text of the Schedules to the Agreement giving the provisions relating to BNOC's rights and the limitation of those rights will be made available on request from the Department of Energy.

4. Licences may be granted subject to special conditions governing the notice required for, and the timing and circumstances of operations carried out thereunder. It should also be noted that on certain blocks, designated by an asterisk in Schedule I, the areas within which drilling may take place will be restricted.

Method of application

5. Paragraphs 6 to 10 below apply to applications for blocks listed in Schedule I. Paragraphs 11 to 15 apply to applications for blocks listed in Schedule II.

Applications for blocks listed in Schedule I

6. In respect of blocks listed in Schedule I:

(i) applications should be made on a standard application form available from the Department of Energy. Applicants should note that the Secretary of State will entertain applications only for blocks specifically identified in the application and drawn from those listed in Schedule I;

(ii) applications should be delivered between 0930 and 1645 hours on Friday 14 January 1983 or between 0930 and 1200 hours on Monday 17 January 1983 to the Petroleum Production Division of the Department of Energy at Thames House South, Millbank, London SW1P 4QJ, together with a remittance in respect of the appropriate application fee calculated in accordance with Regulation 11(2) of the Petroleum (Production) Regulations 1982;

(iii) no applications will be accepted after 1200 hours on 17 January 1983;

(iv) applicants should indicate any preference they attach to the blocks to which the application relates and should also indicate if blocks are applied for as alternatives;

(v) applications should be accompanied by details of the work programme the applicant proposes to carry out if awarded a licence.

7. Applicants will be judged against the background of the continuing need for expeditious, thorough and efficient exploration to identify oil and gas resources of the UK Continental Shelf and the following factors in particular will be borne in mind when examining applications:

(a) technical competence to undertake a programme of exploration and production;

(b) capability to produce funds commensurate with work programme obligations in respect of initial exploration and the extent of access to adequate funds in the event of a commercial discovery being made;

(c) where the applicant already holds or has held a licence, his overall performance to date in meeting licence obligations. In cases where the applicant holds a petroleum production licence, especial consideration will be given to the applicant's performance in thoroughly exploring and where appropriate appraising his licensed area, and to his intentions on further exploration and appraisal of that area;

(d) exploration already done by or on behalf of the applicant which is relevant to the areas applied for;

(e) the extent of the contribution which the applicant has made or is planning to make to the economy of the U.K. including the strengthening of the U.K. balance of payments, the growth of industry and employment and the involvement of U.K. organisations in research into new concepts, and in the design and demonstration of associated techniques and equipment, for application on the U.K.C.S.;

(f) where a body incorporated in a country outside the U.K. applies for a licence or holds a controlling interest in the applicant, how far equitable treatment is afforded in such other country;

(g) whether the applicant subscribes to the Memorandum of Understanding to ensure that full and fair opportunity is provided to U.K. industry to compete for orders of goods and services. Where the applicant is, or has been, a licensee, his past performance in providing full and fair opportunity to U.K. industry will be taken fully into account;

(h) whether the applicant subscribes to the Memorandum of Understanding to grant reasonable

access to representatives of independent trade unions to his offshore installations; and

- (i) the applicant's record in respect of training for employment on offshore installations.

8. Following examination of all the applications the Secretary of State will select the applicants to whom he is prepared to award licences. If there are two or more applicants for a block who would be equally acceptable to the Secretary of State as licensees for that block he may suggest that the licence should be held jointly by some or all of such applicants.

9. The selected applicants will be offered licences on condition that within 14 working days of the date on which the Secretary of State makes the offer of an award:

- (a) they confirm acceptance of a work programme proposed by the Secretary of State following discussion with the applicants concerned;
- (b) they remit to the Secretary of State the appropriate payment referred to in paragraph 2(i) above; and
- (c) they confirm in writing that they are prepared to enter into the Agreement described in paragraph 3 above.

10. Unsuccessful applicants will be notified in writing.

Applications for blocks listed in Schedule II

11. In respect of the blocks listed in Schedule II:

- (i) application should be by way of tender submitted on a special tender form enclosed in a plain envelope having a special label and delivered by hand to the Petroleum Production Division of the Department of Energy, Thames House South, Millbank, London between 1000 and 1200 hours on Monday 17 January 1983. Copies of the special tender form and label are available from the Department of Energy;
- (ii) no tenders will be accepted after 1200 hours on 17 January 1983;
- (iii) the tender form should quote separately in respect of each block applied for the amount in sterling of the additional initial payment tendered (referred to in paragraph 2(ii) above). Applicants should note that the Secretary of State will entertain applications only for blocks specifically identified in the application and drawn from those listed in Schedule II;
- (iv) tenders transferable between blocks will not be accepted;
- (v) the envelope enclosing the tender should also contain:
- (a) a deposit in sterling equivalent to ten per cent of the additional initial payment tendered in the form of a cheque or a bank draft made payable to the Department of Energy and drawn on a bank which is a member of the Committee of London Clearing Bankers or the Committee of Scottish Clearing Bankers or the Northern Ireland Bankers' Association and each such cheque or draft will be paid into the bank account of the Department; and
- (b) a separate payment in the form of a cheque made payable to the Department of Energy in respect of the appropriate application fee calculated in accordance with Regulation 11(2) of the Petroleum (Production) Regulations 1982;
- (vi) no specific work programme need be stated in the application but information on the technical competence and financial capability of applicants will be required.

12. The Secretary of State reserves the right to reject the highest or any other tender, on all or any of the following grounds:

- (a) if he is not satisfied that the tenderer has at his disposal the necessary technical resources to carry out an effective programme of exploration;

- (b) if he is not satisfied that the tenderer has access to the necessary financial resources to carry out an effective programme of exploration;
- (c) where the tenderer has not observed all or any of the provisions of paragraph 11;
- (d) for any other reason, which will be disclosed to the tenderer on request.

13. Subject to the Secretary of State's right in accordance with the provisions described in paragraph 12 above to accept or reject any tender, licences will be awarded to the highest tenderer. Each successful tenderer will be informed of the acceptance of his tender by the Secretary of State by letter sent by recorded delivery post to the tenderer at the address given in the tender form. Within 14 working days of the date upon which the Secretary of State's letter of acceptance is posted the tenderer shall:

- (a) pay the balance of the additional initial payment tendered together with the appropriate initial payment referred to in paragraph 2(i) above; and
- (b) confirm in writing his willingness to enter into the Agreement referred to in paragraph 3 above.

In the event that the successful tenderer fails to fulfil either of these conditions by the due date, his deposit will be forfeited to the Secretary of State. Thereafter the Secretary of State may, subject to paragraph 12, award a licence for the block to any other tenderer for that block, and the provisions of this paragraph shall apply in relation to any such tenderer in the same manner as they applied in relation to the defaulting tenderer.

14. In the event of two or more acceptable tenders for a block being of equal amount, the Secretary of State may propose that a licence for that block be awarded to such tenderers jointly, each tenderer being required to contribute an equal share of the amount tendered. Such tenderers will be informed of the proposal by the Secretary of State by letter sent by recorded delivery post to the tenderers at the addresses given in the tender forms. If within 14 working days of the date on which the Secretary of State's letter was posted, all the tenderers concerned have not:

- (a) paid their shares of the balance of the additional payment tendered; and
- (b) confirmed in writing their willingness to enter into the Agreement referred to in paragraph 3 above;

then the Secretary of State's proposal shall be deemed to have been withdrawn but the tenderers' deposits shall not be forfeited. Thereafter the Secretary of State may award a licence for that block to any tenderer for that block and the provisions of paragraph 13 shall apply in relation to any such tenderer.

15. Tenderers who are not offered licences will be notified by post. Deposits for such unsuccessful tenders will be returned without interest as soon as possible after the successful tenderers have accepted their licence awards and in any case not later than 31 March 1983.

This Deed is made the day of 198
Between The Secretary of State for Energy (hereinafter
called "the Secretary of State") of the first part The
British National Oil Corporation (hereinafter called
"BNO") of the second part and

(hereinafter called "the Licensee") of the third part
Whereas:

(1) Immediately prior to the completion of this deed the
Secretary of State granted and the Licensee accepted the
petroleum production Licence hereinafter defined
in respect of the seaward area described in Schedule
1 hereto

(2) As a condition of receiving such Licence the Licensee
has agreed to enter into this deed.

Now in pursuance of such agreement This Deed
Witnesseth And It Is Hereby Agreed as follows:

1. (1) In this deed the following expressions have the
meanings hereby respectively assigned to them:
"the Licence" means petroleum production licence
number P. of even date herewith granted by the
Secretary of State to the Licensee;

"model clauses" means the model clauses incorporated
in the Licence and set out in Schedule 5 to the Petrol-
eum (Production) Regulations 1982;

"Commercial Decision" means a decision to prepare a
programme for the getting of petroleum from the
licensed area or any part thereof or for the erecting
or carrying out of relevant works in the licensed area
or any part thereof;

"Petroleum Operations" means any and all operations
conducted in the licensed area or any part thereof and
directed towards the getting of petroleum therefrom
but excluding operations the purpose whereof is
searching for petroleum and also excluding any such
operations carried out prior to the taking of a Com-
mercial Decision;

"the licensed area" and "petroleum" have the meanings
respectively assigned to them in paragraph (1) of
clause 1 of the model clauses;

"relevant works" has the meaning assigned to it in
paragraph (9) of clause 14 of the model clauses.

(2) Any obligations which are to be observed and
performed by the Licensee shall at any time at which
the Licensee is more than one person be joint and
several obligations.

2. (1) Upon being so required in writing by the Secretary
of State the Licensee will execute an assignment in the
form set out in Schedule 2 hereto of the Licence from
itself to itself and BNO.

(2) Such assignment shall be completed within four
months from the date of the Secretary of State's
request.

(3) The Secretary of State may not make a request
under paragraph (1) of this clause 2 until the taking of
a Commercial Decision.

3. (1) Upon being so requested in writing by the Secretary
of State the Licensee will either:

(a) enter into an agreement with BNO providing for
the conduct of Petroleum Operations in that part
of the licensed area to which a Commercial
Decision relates and incorporating the provisions
set out in Schedule 3 hereto; or

(b) procure that any subsisting agreement for the
conduct of Petroleum Operations in the licensed
area as a whole or in that part thereof to which a
Commercial Decision relates shall be amended by
the inclusion therein of BNO as a party and by
the incorporation therein of the provisions set out
in Schedule 3 hereto.

(2) Any agreement entered into in accordance with paragraph (1)(a) of this clause 3 shall forthwith upon completion be submitted for approval by the Secretary of State and shall contain a provision that with the exception of clause 5 of Schedule 3 it shall not come into full force and effect until it has been approved in writing by the Secretary of State.

(3) Any agreement amended in accordance with paragraph (1)(b) of this clause 3 shall in its amended form forthwith upon completion be submitted for approval by the Secretary of State and shall in its amended form contain a provision that with the exception of clause 5 of Schedule 3 it shall not come into full force and effect until it has been approved in writing by the Secretary of State.

(4) Any agreement in accordance with paragraph (1)(a) of this clause 3 and any amendment to an agreement in accordance with paragraph (1)(b) of this clause 3 shall be completed within four months from the date of the Secretary of State's request.

(5) The Secretary of State may not make a request under paragraph (1) of this clause 3 until after the taking of a Commercial Decision.

4. The Licensee shall notify the Secretary of State in writing of every Commercial Decision relating to the licensed area or any part or parts thereof within one month of the date of the taking of such Commercial Decision and shall at the same time inform the Secretary of State of the part or parts of the licensed area to which the Commercial Decision in question relates.

5. A direction by the Secretary of State pursuant to paragraph (2) of clause 14 of the model clauses shall for the purposes of this deed and unless the Secretary of State shall otherwise agree in writing be deemed to be a notification by the Licensee of a Commercial Decision.

6. In the event that he learns of or in accordance with the terms of this deed he is notified of a second or subsequent Commercial Decision the Secretary of State may make a request in relation thereto under paragraph (1) of clause 3 of this deed notwithstanding that he either does not or cannot make any further request under paragraph (1) of clause 2 of this deed.

7. The Licensee shall procure that any third party:

- (a) who becomes a licensee of the Licence or
- (b) who becomes entitled to:
 - (i) the benefit of any right granted by the Licence or derived from a right so granted or
 - (ii) any petroleum won and saved from the licensed area or
 - (iii) any proceeds of sale of such petroleum

shall (unless the Secretary of State agrees otherwise in writing) enter into an agreement under seal with the Secretary of State and BNOC to accept and observe and perform the terms of this deed in every respect as if it had been an original party hereto.

8. The Licensee shall ensure that any mortgage or charge or encumbrance of any description or any rights in security of any description howsoever constituted or arising which directly or indirectly affects any right granted by the Licence or derived from any right so granted shall be and shall be expressed to be subject to the provisions of this deed.

9. In the event of a licence being granted to the Licensee wholly or partly in substitution for or replacement of the Licence the terms of this deed shall apply to that licence as they apply to the Licence.

10. The Licensee hereby acknowledges that its obligations under clauses 2 and 3 of this deed are owed to the Secretary of State and BNOC severally and that the performance of such obligation may be enforced accordingly. And it is further expressly agreed and acknowledged by and among all the parties hereto that the obligations of the Licensee hereunder can only be sufficiently performed and discharged in the manner herein specified and that performance or discharge by the Licensee in any other manner is not and will not be an adequate substitute.

11. The rights and powers of the Secretary of State under this deed are additional to and their exercise shall not prejudice his rights and powers under the Licence or under any enactment.

12. It is hereby further agreed and declared that any rights vested in BNOC pursuant to this deed may be assigned. Provided That:

- (a) the written consent of the Secretary of State is first obtained;
- (b) the assignment is made in writing;
- (c) the assignment is made in favour of a state corporation; and
- (d) written notice of the assignment is given to the Licensee.

13. This deed shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of (England and Wales) (Scotland) (Northern Ireland).

(N.B. The governing law will be that applicable to the area in which the licensed area is situated).
