The Civil Service Commissioners for Northern Ireland hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Ministry of Finance for Northern Ireland,

REGULATIONS RESPECTING AN OPEN COMPETITION FOR THE SITUATION OF WRITING ASSISTANT (FEMALE).

- 1. A candidate must be 17 years of age or upwards and under 19 years of age on the 1st January, 1930.
 - 2. A candidate must be-

 - (a) unmarried or a widow,
 (b) a natural born British subject, and
 (c) the daughter of a father who is a natural born British subject.
- 3. A person upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent, cannot, if successful, be appointed until the consent of the Ministry of Finance has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

PART II.

Marks.

Interview 100 Part I will take place in Belfast on the 17th December, 1929. Part II will take place in Belfast on a later date, which will be notified to those concerned in due course.

5. Admission to Part II of the competition will be restricted to such number of the candidates who obtain the highest aggregate marks in Part I, as may be determined in relation to the number of situations to be filled.

6. Subject to compliance with the provisions of paragraphs 1, 2 and 3, candidates will be offered vacant appointments in the order in which they are finally placed in regard to their aggregate marks in Part I and II of the examination. No candidate will be eligible for appointment who does not exhibit a reasonable standard of proficiency.

7. No expenses in connection with attendance at any part of the competition will be allowed.

8. Successful candidates will be required to satisfy the Commissioners regarding their health, physical fitness and character.

9. A fee of ten shillings will be required from each candidate applying to enter the

10. Applications from prospective candidates must be on the prescribed form, and must be accompanied by the prescribed fee, and they must reach the Secretary to the Commission not later than the 31st October, 1929. A form of application can be obtained from-

SYLLABUS.

English .- A candidate will be required to write an essay or letter on a prescribed subject, or to expand a summary supplied to her. She will be expected to keep closely to the subject, to arrange her ideas in orderly fashion, and to write concisely. Effective and exact expression will be rewarded.

She will also be required to summarise the substance of a passage or set of correspondence placed before her, and to answer any questions, whether in relation thereto or otherwise, which will tend to show her power of understanding and using English. Spelling will be taken into account in all subjects.

Handwriting.—A special test will imposed, and, in addition, handwriting will be

taken into account in other subjects.

Arithmetic.—First four rules, simple and compound, including imperial and metric weights and measures; simple reduction; vulgar fractions and decimals, excluding recurring decimals; unitary method in proportion; (There will be a special test in averages. totting.)

General Knowledge.—The questions set in this subject will be designed to test the can-

didate as regards

(a) general intelligence,

(b) general education and information, and

(c) correct and concise expression.

The questions will refer mainly to present-day matters, although they will not necessarily be confined thereto. A liberal choice of questions will be given.

THE MIDWIVES AND NURSING HOMES ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1929. REGULATIONS MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS UNDER SECTION 9.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland on the 6th September, 1929, made Regulations in pursuance of Section 9 of the above-mentioned Act with respect to:-

(a) applications for registration of nursing

homes;

(b) the records to be kept of patients received into, of miscarriages occurring in, and of children born in a nursing home, and of children born in a nursing home who are removed therefrom otherwise than into the care of any parent, guardian or relative; and

(c) the notification of any death and the cause thereof occurring in a nursing

home.

THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS FOR NORTHERN IRELAND.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Castlederg Union ;

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Londonderry Union;

And to all others whom it may concern:

WHEREAS by Section 1 of the Poor Relief (Ireland) Act, 1914, as amended by Section 23 (4) of the Local Government (Emergency Provisions) Act, 1916, it is enacted in effect as follows:

(1) The Local Government Board for

Ireland may by Order modify or repeal the provisions of Section 9 of the Poor Relief (Ireland) Act, 1847 (which prohibits the giving of relief from the poor rates of a union to any person not within the union when so relieved) so far as respects any union specified in the Order, if, in the opinion of the Board, the modification or repeal is necessary or expedient for the better administration of the Poor Relief (Ireland) Acts, 1838 to 1900, and may by the same or any subsequent Order make or provide for such adjustments and apportionments of the property, powers, duties, income, liabilities, and expenses of any Board of Guardians or other local authority affected as appear to the Board to be proper.

(2) An Order under this Section may con-in such consequential, incidental and tain supplemental provisions as the Board may deem necessary, and shall have effect as from any date which may be specified therein for

And whereas by virtue of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, the aforesaid functions of the Local Government Board for Ireland as regards services in Northern Ireland have been transferred to the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland:

And whereas it is necessary and expedient for the better administration of the Poor Relief (Ireland) Acts, 1838 to 1900, that the provisions of Section 9 of the Poor Relief (Ire-Act, 1847, should as respects the Castlederg Union and the Londonderry Union be modified in order that certain destitute poor persons being inmates of the Workhouse of, or otherwise relieved in, the Castlederg Union, may be lawfully removed to and relieved in Londonderry Union, and it is necessary to make and specify the provisions hereinafter appearing with respect to the said Unions:

Now, therefore, the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry") in exercise of the powers vested in it by the Poor Relief (Ireland) Acts, 1838 to 1914, as extended by Section 23 (4) of the Local Government (Emergency Provisions) Act, 1916, and of all other powers in this behalf enabling it, but without prejudice to the power enabling it to make any subsequent Order in this behalf, hereby orders and declares as respects the Castlederg Union and the Londonderry Union in manner following, that is to

1. Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 9 of the Poor Relief (Ireland) Act, 1847, destitute poor persons who by law were or shall be entitled to relief (other than outdoor relief or medical or surgical relief) in the Castlederg Union may be lawfully relieved in the Londonderry Union until the Ministry shall otherwise direct.

- 2. The sum to be paid in respect of each destitute poor person received under the provisions of this Order from the Castlederg Union shall be such sum as may from time to time be agreed upon between the Guardians of the poor of the Castlederg Union and the Guardians of the poor of the Londonderry Union, or in default of agreement as afore-said, such sum as may be determined by the
- 3. (1) Notwithstanding anything contained in the General Order of the Local Government Board for Ireland of the 5th day of July, 1901, the offices of Master of the Workhouse,

Matron of the Workhouse, Nurse of the Workhouse, Wardmaster of the Workhouse, and Wardmistress of the Workhouse shall, as regards Castlederg Union, be abolished as from the 1st October, 1929, subject to the provisions hereinafter set forth.

(2) The Guardians of the Poor of the Union shall, subject to the Castlederg approval of the Ministry, appoint a fit person to perform the duties of the office of Superintendent Nurse at the Workhouse of the said Union, as hereinafter specified, that is to

It shall be the duty of the Superintendent Nurse, subject to any special direction that may be given by the Ministry

(a) To be responsible for the safe keeping of stores in the Infirmary and the Fever Hospital of the Castlederg Union.
(b) To exercise disciplinary control over

the said Infirmary and Fever Hospital.

(c) To keep (l) a record of all persons admitted to and discharged from the Castlederg Union Infirmary and Fever Hospital.

(2) The Medical Weekly Return, so far as the required particulars can be

entered therein by her.

(3) A daily Issue-from-Store Book.
(4) The Clothing Receipt and Conversion Book (Form 31 of the Union Accounts Order, 1905).

(d) To be responsible for the due examination of all goods supplied at the Workhouse, and from day to day to certify in the invoices therefor whether such goods are of proper quality and have been duly received in good condition.

(e) To be responsible for the dispatch of the ambulance whenever the same may

be required.

(f) To give immediate information of the death of any inmate of the Workhouse to the Registrar of Births, Deaths and Marriages, and to the nearest relatives of the deceased who may be known to her, and who may reside within a reasonable distance.

(g) To send for the Medical Officer whenever he may be specially required to attend any inmate, and for the Chaplain or other licensed minister of the same religious persuasion as the inmate.

(h) Generally to observe, fulfil and execute all lawful orders of the Guardians suitable to the office of Superintendent

The existing nurse of the Workhouse shall, subject to the provisions of Article 40 of the General Order made by the Local Government Board for Ireland, on the 18th day of December, 1882, as amended by Article 5 of the said General Order of the 5th day of July, 1901, be the first Superintendent Nurse at the Workhouse.

(3) Article 34 of the General Order of the 5th day of February, 1849, and Article 4 (f) of the said General Order of the 5th day of July, 1901, shall in their application to the Guardians of the Poor of the Castlederg Union be varied by the substitution therein of the words "Superintendent Nurse" the words "Master of the Workhouse."

(4) All books and records hitherto kept by the Master of the Workhouse in pursuance of any Order, shall be kept in future by the

Clerk of the Union, except such as the Superintendent Nurse is specificially required to keep.

The following regulations shall be substituted for those contained in Articles II and III of the General Order of the Fourth day of May, 1896, as extended by the General Order of the Twenty-eighth day of June, 1918, with respect to the Castlederg Union.

Article II.—Whenever in the course of his professional treatment of Workhouse inmates, or of poor persons admitted into the Infirmary of the Workhouse under Section 3 of the Poor-Law Relief (Ireland) Act, 1862, or into any building provided by the Board of Guardians for a Fever Hospital, or into any part of the Workhouse appropriated as a Fever Hospital, a case arises which in the opinion of the Medical Officer necessitates his obtaining the assistance of another medical practitioner, the Medical Officer shall, if the circumstances of the case admit of such delay, apply to the Board of Guardians for authority to obtain the assistance of any duly qualified medical practitioner. If, however, the circumstances be so urgent as to render it necessary to obtain the requisite assistance before the next following meeting of the Board of Guardians, the Medical Officer shall apply in writing to the Clerk of the Board of Guardians to obtain the services of the nearest available duly qualified medical practitioner; and it shall thereupon be the duty of the Clerk to obtain such assistance, and to report the circumstances to the Board of Guardians at their next following meeting.

Article III.-If the Medical Officer be temporarily incapacitated by illness or other cause from performing his duties, he shall immediately, if practicable, communicate the fact to the Clerk, who shall thereupon employ some duly qualified medical practitioner to discharge the duties of the Medical Officer during such temporary incapacity, but not for any longer period than until the next meeting of the Board of Guardians, when the Clerk shall report the circumstances to them, and, if the necessity still exists, the Board of Guardians shall either continue such employment or make such other arrangements as they shall deem fit for the discharge of the Medical Officer's duties during his temporary incapacity

4. Notwithstanding anything contained in Article 2 of the General Order of the Local Government Board for Ireland, bearing date the 18th day of December, 1882, the Guardians of the Poor of the Castlederg Union shall not be required to hold an Ordinary Meeting more often than twice in

every month.
5. This Order shall have effect as from the

First day of October, 1929.
