## ABERCORN.

WHEREAS by the Petty Sessions Clerk (Ireland) Act, 1888, the Lord Lieutenant was empowered to make Rules for the purposes of

carrying into effect the provisions of that Act, and by the Petty Sessions Clerk (Ireland) Amendment Act, 1907, the said power was extended to the making of Rules respecting the qualifications, salaries, appointment, and removal of assistants of the Clerk of Petty Sessions at Belfast:

And whereas by the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, the Irish Free State (Consequential Provisions) Act, 1922, and the Orders made thereunder, the powers formerly vested in the Lord Lieutenant are now in their application to Northern Ireland vested in the Governor of Northern Ireland:

And whereas on the 22nd day of November, 1923, Their Excellencies the Lords Justices of Northern Ireland made certain Rules respecting the qualifications, salaries appointment, and removal of assistants to the Clerk of Petty Sessions at Belfast:

And whereas it is expedient to vary the said Rules made on the 22nd day of November, 1923.

Now, I, James Albert Edward, Duke of Abercorn, K.G., K.P., Governor of Northern Ireland, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the above Acts, and all other powers me thereunto enabling, do hereby direct that Assistants to the Clerk of Petty Sessions at Belfast shall be eligible for appointment to the office of Clerk of Petty Sessions up to the age of sixty years in lieu of fifty-years, as prescribed in Paragraph 5 of the aforesaid Rules.

Given at Government House at Hillsborough this 10th day of March, 1930.
