A PROCLAMATION
FOR APPOINTING SATURDAY,
JULY 12th, 1930.

A BANK HOLIDAY AND A PUBLIC HOLIDAY IN NORTHERN IRELAND.

I, James Albert Edward, Duke of Abercorn, Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, Knight of the Most Illustrious Order of St. Patrick, Governor of Northern Ireland, by and with the advice of the Privy Council of Northern Ireland in pursuance of the Bank Holidays Act, 1871, the Holidays Extension Act, 1875, and the Irish Free State (Consequential Provisions) Act, 1922, and of every power Me thereunto enabling, Do Hereby Appoint Saturday, the Twelfth day of July next, as a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday, and as a Public Holiday in Northern Ireland, under, and in accordance with the said Acts, and I do, by this Proclamation command the said day to be so observed, and all loving subjects of His Majesty to order themselves accordingly.

Given at the Council Chamber, Belfast, this Sixth day of May, in the Year of Our Lord, One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty.

GOD SAVE THE KING.

PETROLEUM (CONSOLIDATION) ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1929.

BY THE GOVERNOR AND PRIVY COUNCIL OF NORTHERN IRELAND.

(Signed) ABERCORN.

WHEREAS by the Petroleum (Consolidation) Act (Northern Ireland), 1929 (a) (in this Order called the Act of 1929), the Governor of Northern Ireland is empowered to apply to any substance any of the provisions of the Act of 1929 specified in the Order with such modifications as may seem to the said Governor to be desirable, having regard to the nature of the substance to which the Order relates:

And whereas it is desirable that certain provisions of the Act of 1929 shall apply to Bisulphide of Carbon:

Now I, James Albert Edward, Duke of Abercorn, Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, Knight of the Most Illustrious Order of St. Patrick, Governor of Northern Ireland, by and with the advice of the Privy Council of Northern Ireland, by virtue of the powers conferred upon Me by Section 19 of the Act of 1929, and of all other powers enabling Me in that behalf, hereby order as follows:—

- 1. So much of the Act of 1929 as relates to the conveyance of petroleum spirit by road shall apply to Bisulphide of Carbon, and the label on the vessel or package containing Bisulphide of Carbon shall bear in conspicuous characters the words "Bisulphide of Carbon, Highly Inflammable," together with the name and address of the sender.
