THE SHOPS ACT, 1912.

BY THE GOVERNOR OF NORTHERN
IRELAND,
ABERCORN.

WHEREAS the Council of the Urban District of Newtownards, in the County of Down, have submitted to me a Closing Order made by the said Council on the 25th day of January, 1930, in pursuance of the provisions of the Shops Act, 1912, 2 Geo. V., chap. 3, fixing the hours at which all shops in the Urban District of Newtownards in which the Trade or Business of a Hairdresser or Barber is carried on, shall be closed for the serving of customers:

And whereas the said Council duly published the said Closing Order on the 25th January, 1930, and the 1st February, 1930.

And whereas I have received no objections to the said Order within the time limit mentioned in the said publications:
