WHEREAS by Section 12, Sub-section (1) of the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920,

as it applies in Northern Ireland, it is provided that an Umpire and one or more Deputy Umpires may be appointed by the Governor of Northern Ireland for the purposes of that Act:

And Whereas it is desirable that a Deputy Umpire should be appointed for Northern Ireland:

Now, Therefore, I, James Albert Edward, Duke of Abercorn, Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, Knight of the Most Illustrious Order of Saint Patrick, Governor of Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers vested in me by that Act, hereby appoint Lancelot Ernest Curran, Esquire, Barrister-at-Law, to be a Deputy Umpire for the purposes of the Act until the 30th September, 1931.

MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1926.

Imported Frozen or Chilled Salmon and Trout.
A Draft of an Order in Council to require imported frozen or chilled salmon and trout to be marked with an indication of origin in accordance with the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, has been laid before Parliament as required by Section 7 of the Act.
