CREPE BANDAGES AND CREPE
BINDERS.

With reference to the notice which was
published in the London, Edinburgh and
Belfast Gazettes of the 7th November, 1930,
regarding a reference made by the Board of
Trade to the Standing Committee under the
Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, in respect of
the following descriptions of imported goods:—

Crepe bandages and crepe binders of all
descriptions, made of wool, cotton, silk,
artificial silk, or mixtures thereof,
the Board of Trade hereby give notice, in
accordance with the provisions of Section 2,
Sub-section 7, that a Report has been made
