This day His Excellency the Lord Lieutenant and General Governor of Ireland was pleased, in the name of and on behalf of His Majesty the King, to give his Assent to the following Bills, agreed upon by both Houses of Parliament of Northern Ireland, viz.:—

Live Stock Breeding, Church Temporalities Fund, Appropriation, National Health Insurance

GOVERNMENT OF NORTHERN IRELAND.

MINISTRY OF FINANCE.

WHEREAS in pursuance of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, the Ministry of Finance for Northern Ireland has been directed to administer in Northern Ireland as from the 1st day of January, 1922, the Irish Services formerly administered by the Commissioners of Charitable Donations and Bequests for Ireland: and the powers and duties which before that day were exercised, performed and discharged by the said Commissioners and their Department and officers under the Government of the United Kingdom in relation to those services, were as from that day, in so far as they relate to Irish Services in Northern Ireland, transferred to the Ministry of Finance:

And whereas under Sub-section (3) of Section 1 of the Ministries of Northern Ireland Act, 1921 (N.I.) the Minister of Finance may if he thinks fit by minute to be laid before both Houses of Parliament assign any specified powers or duties of the Ministry of Finance to such Officer, Officers or Committee as he may appoint to exercise or perform the same under any designation having reference to such powers or duties:

And whereas by Minute dated the 12th day of June, 1922, certain powers or duties of the Ministry of Finance therein specified were assigned by me to a Committee to be known as "The Charities Advisory Committee" and consisting of not more than twelve members whose composition and qualifications were therein set forth and of whom eleven were by the said Minute appointed as first members of the said Committee.

And whereas it is desirable to appoint one other person as member of the said Committee to complete the said number of twelve members.

Now I, The Right Honourable Hugh MacDowell Pollock, Minister of Finance, in pursuance of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, and all other powers enabling me in this behalf do hereby appoint John Milne Barbour, Esq., D.L., M.P., Financial Secretary to the Ministry of Finance, to be a member of the said Committee.
