Civil Service Commission,
July 21, 1931.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE COMPETITIVE SELECTION OF SECOND CLASS CLERKS FOR SERVICE UNDER THE SUPREME COURT OF NORTHERN IRELAND.

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time. Competitions do not take place at fixed intervals, but are held as occasion arises on the occurrence of vacancies.

1. Candidates must have attained the age of 20 and must not have attained the age of 22 on a date to be fixed in respect of the competition in which they are to take part. The upper age limit may, however, be extended to 30 in the case of candidates who possess professional legal qualifications or have had actual experience of legal business, and may further be extended to 50 in the case of candidates who were employed prior to 1st January, 1929, in a temporary capacity as a clerk in any of the offices of the Supreme Court of Judicature of Northern Ireland, and are still so employed at the date of the vacancy.

2. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject: provided that exception may be made:—

(a) In the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.

(b) In the case of natural-born British subjects who served in His Majesty's Armed Forces in the Great War between 4th August, 1914, and 11th November, 1918.

(c) In the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied, in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalisation or by any other voluntary and formal act.

3. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to apply for appointment.

No person actually serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force will be eligible for consideration unless he produces, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to apply for appointment, dated before his appearance before the Selection Board, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent

cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

4. The Lord Chief Justice will take such steps as he thinks most appropriate to make known the existence of any vacancy or vacancies which he desires to fill on any one occasion, and the Civil Service Commissioners will satisfy themselves that the steps taken have been such as to secure all desirable publicity.

5. Application shall be addressed in the first instance to the Secretary of the Supreme Court of Northern Ireland, and shall be made on a form to be obtained from that office, which must be stamped by the applicant with a "Civil Service" stamp or stamps to the value of two shillings and sixpence; this fee is payable in respect of the application and will not be returned in any circumstances. The Lord Chief Justice will examine the candidates' credentials and will submit to the Civil Service Commissioners the names of such candidates as appear to be qualified and to be best fitted for appointment. The Civil Service Commissioners, if dissatisfied with the number or quality of candidates for any vacancy, may require further search to be made for qualified candidates. The Civil Service Commissioners may, if they think fit, assist in the scrutiny of the application forms of the candidates.

6. Candidates who are recommended by the Lord Chief Justice and are accepted by the Civil Service Commissioners will be summoned to an interview before a Selection Board sitting in Northern Ireland, who will recommend for the vacancies existing those candidates who appear to them to possess the highest qualifications; the decision of the Selection Board will be final. The Selection Board will be nominated by the Commissioners in consultation with the Lord Chief Justice, who will be represented on the Selection Board in the proportion of one in three or two in five; they will take into consideration the candidate's record of experience and education, any recommendations that they may receive from persons named by candidates as having direct knowledge of their work in the past, and the personal qualities of the candidates as shown at the interview; and on their estimation of all the above evidence they will frame their decisions.

Until further notice, preference will be given to candidates who served in His Majesty's Forces in the Great War between the 4th August, 1914, and the 11th November, 1918.

7. Candidates recommended for appointment by the Selection Board may be required before appointment to pass a qualifying examination in (1) English, Arithmetic and General Knowledge, (2) Law; but the Civil Service Commissioners may at their discretion exempt from examination under (1) any candidate who possesses the Senior Certificate of the Ministry of Education of Northern Ireland or has passed any other examination which in their opinion is of equivalent or higher standard; and they may exempt from examination under (2) any candidate who possesses legal qualifications which in their opinion justify such exemption; and they may exempt entirely from a qualifying examination any candidate who has been employed prior to 1st January, 1929, in a temporary capacity as a clerk in any of

the offices of the Supreme Court of Judicature of Northern Ireland, and is still so employed at the date of the vacancy, if so recommended by the Lord Chief Justice.

8. In addition to the fee of two shillings and sixpence payable on application (Clause 5), each candidate admitted to the written examination (Clause 7) will be required to pay a fee of £4 2s. 6d., being the balance of the prescribed fee of £4 5s. A candidate exempted from both parts of the written examination would be required to pay the balance of the prescribed fee before appointment.

9. Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character.

Female candidates must be unmarried or widows, and will be required to resign their appointments on marriage.

10. Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons will disqualify them for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard spontaneous recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's work, whether at school, at the university, in industry or business, or otherwise.

THE LISBURN GAS ORDER, 1931.

NOTICE OF APPLICATION for a Special Order under the Gas Regulation Act, 1920.

The Urban District Council of Lisburn in the County of Antrim (hereinafter called "the Applicants") Hereby Give Notice that they intend making application to the Ministry of Commerce for Northern Ireland for a Special Order (hereinafter called "the Order") under Section 10 of the Gas Regulation Act, 1920.

1. To repeal the following words in subsection (3) of Section 21 of the Lisburn Urban District Council Act, 1909 (9 Edw. 7, c. 58), which deprive the Council of the right to expend money upon the provision of gas fittings, etc., unless such money is expended through a contractor:—

"(A) It shall not be lawful for the Council to expend money (except through a contractor) upon the provision of such fittings or of labour and materials required for the fixing, repairing or removal thereof upon or from the premises of their consumers or prospective consumers."

2. To provide for the costs of and incidental to the obtaining of the Order.

And Notice is Hereby Further Given that a copy of the draft Order and an Ordnance map showing the boundaries of the existing area of supply and the situation of the existing works have been deposited for public inspection at the Offices of the Applicants at the Town Hall, Lisburn, and with the Clerk of the Crown and Peace for the County of Antrim, and the Secretary of the Antrim County Council at their Offices, Courthouse, Crumlin Road, Belfast, with the Clerk of the Crown and Peace for the County of Down, and the Secretary of the Down County Council at their Offices, Courthouse, Downpatrick, and with the Clerks of

the Rural District Councils of Lisburn and Hillsborough at their Offices, Poor Law Office, Lisburn.

And Notice is Hereby Further Given that any local or other public authority, company or person desirous of bringing before the Ministry of Commerce any objection to the draft Order must do so as provided by Rule 5 of the Statutory Rules and Orders relating to applications for Special Orders under the Gas Regulation Act, 1920, the provisions of which rule as adapted to Northern Ireland are as follows:—

“(1) Any local or other public authority, company or person desiring to bring before the Ministry of Commerce for Northern Ireland any objection to the draft Order may do so by registered letter addressed to the Secretary, Ministry of Commerce, Northern Ireland, 15 Donegall Square West, Belfast, and despatched on or before a date to be stated in the advertisement, which shall not be earlier than 30 days after the date of which publication of the advertisement will be completed. Any such application shall state:—

- (a) the specific grounds of objection; and
- (b) the omissions, additions or modifications asked for.

A copy of the objection shall be forwarded to the applicants for the Order or their agents at the same time as it is sent to the Ministry of Commerce for Northern Ireland.

No part of the month of August shall be included in calculating the above-mentioned period of 30 days.

(2) As soon as practicable after the period allowed for objections has expired the applicants or their agents shall furnish the Ministry of Commerce for Northern Ireland with their replies to any objections which have been made, and shall at the same time send a copy to the respective objectors.”

The last date on which objections may be despatched to the Ministry of Commerce for Northern Ireland in accordance with Rule 5 is the 26th day of September, 1931.

**CIVIL AUTHORITIES (SPECIAL
POWERS) ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND),
1922.**

WHEREAS certain Regulations for Peace and Order in Northern Ireland are contained in the Schedule to the Civil Authorities (Special Powers) Act (Northern Ireland), 1922, and it is provided by sub-section (3) of Section 1 of the said Act that the Minister of Home Affairs shall have power to make Regulations (a) for making further provision for the preservation of the Peace and Maintenance of Order, and (b) for varying or revoking any provision of the Regulations, whether contained in the said Schedule, or made as aforesaid, and that any Regulations made as aforesaid shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act have effect and be enforced in like manner as Regulations contained in the said Schedule:

Now Therefore, I, the Right Honourable Sir Richard Dawson Bates, Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, do make the following Regulation for making further provision for the preservation of the Peace and Maintenance of Order, and the said Regulation

shall be enforced and have effect in like manner as Regulations contained in the said Schedule, and the said Regulation now made, and the Regulations contained in the said Schedule shall have effect and be construed as if the said Regulation now made formed part of the said Regulations in said Schedule, that is to say:—

8a. The Civil Authority may make Orders prohibiting in any area the erection of any monument or other memorial if he has reason to suspect that the erection of such monument or other memorial would be of a character calculated to promote the objects of an unlawful association, or to be prejudicial to the preservation of the Peace or Maintenance of Order.

If any such monument or other memorial has been erected, or is in the process of erection, the Civil Authority may cause the same to be removed or destroyed.
