

*Devenish Stream*

- Replacing the culvert underneath Jordanstown Road with a box culvert.
- Replacing 600 mm with 900 mm diameter pipe north of Jordanstown Road.
- Replacing the culvert beneath the Belfast – Antrim Railway line.
- By-passing the existing culvert beneath the disused railway.
- Miscellaneous works including upgrading inlet and outlet structures.

Having determined that the proposed works are not, by reason amongst other things of their nature, size and location, likely to have significant environmental effects it is the Department's intention not to prepare an Environmental Statement.

*Improvement Works to the Ballysally Blagh Drain and Island Vardin Drain, Coleraine, County Londonderry*

The Department of Agriculture for Northern Ireland hereby gives notice in pursuance of Article 12 (as amended) of the Drainage (Northern Ireland) Order 1973 that it proposes to carry out a scheme for the improvement of the Ballysally Blagh Drain and Island Vardin Drain, Coleraine.

It is proposed to regrade and widen the existing channel of both drains. The intended works include the replacement of inadequate county road culverts at Ballysally Road and Atlantic Road, and an accommodation culvert. In addition the railway culvert at University Station and the culvert crossing at the Coleraine by-pass will be improved by the addition of an extra pipeline alongside the existing culverts.

It is also proposed to incorporate environmentally positive features into the works at suitable locations along the Ballysally Blagh Drain.
