after called the "Principal Regulations"), apply shall be reduced by an amount equal to the maximum annual increment awarded to him, in accordance with the Principal Regulations.

3. These Regulations shall take and have effect on and after the 1st December, 1931, and shall thenceforth be construed with and as forming part of the Principal Regulations, and the said Principal Regulations are hereby amended to the extent necessary to give effect to the foregoing provisions.
