

MEDICINES ACT 1968

Amendments and Additions to the European Pharmacopoeia

The Ministers, that is to say the Secretary of State concerned with health in England, the Secretaries of State respectively concerned with health and with agriculture in Wales and in Scotland, the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, the Department of Health and Social Services for Northern Ireland and the Department of Agriculture for Northern Ireland, acting jointly, hereby declare under section 65(7) and (8) of the Medicines Act 1968 that on and after 1st January, 1993, the monographs contained in the sixteenth fascicule of the Second Edition of the European Pharmacopoeia, published under the direction of the Council of Europe (Partial Agreement) in accordance with the Convention on the Elaboration of a European Pharmacopoeia, together with the amendments and additions to the Second Edition of the European Pharmacopoeia adopted by the European Pharmacopoeia Commission on 25th June, 1992 and referred to in the Schedule hereto, are to have effect for the purposes of section 65 of the said Act.

GENERAL IMPORT LICENCE

The Department of Agriculture for Northern Ireland, in accordance with the terms of the above legislation, hereby authorises, subject to the conditions attached to this licence, the landing in Northern Ireland of:

Product: Poultrymeat preparations derived from domestic hens, turkeys, ducks, geese and guinea fowls;

From: Great Britain

until further notice or unless the licence is revoked by the Department.

This licence revokes and replaces Licence No. DANI/GEN/92/37 dated 3rd June, 1992.

CONDITIONS ATTACHING TO THIS LICENCE

1. Each consignment must be accompanied by:
 - (a) A certificate in accordance with the terms of Council Directive 71/118/EEC as amended, annotated in accordance with the terms of Council Directive 88/657/EEC on a trade in minced meat, meat in pieces of less than 100g and meat preparations, signed by duly authorised veterinarian of the Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food stating:
 - (i) details of the consignment ie species, packaging, weight;
 - (ii) address(es) and veterinary approval number(s) of approved establishments;
 - (iii) destination of meat cover means of transport including registration/flight number;
 - (iv) *Health attestation*
 - the poultrymeat preparation described above satisfies the requirements of Directive 91/494/EEC on animal health condition governing intra-Community trade in and imports from third countries of fresh poultrymeat and also the second sub-paragraph of Article 3A.1 of that Directive;
 - the poultrymeat preparation described above bears a mark proving that the meat comes from animals slaughtered in approved slaughter houses;
 - the poultrymeat preparations have been passed fit for human consumption following a veterinary inspection carried out in accordance with Council Directive 71/118/EEC of 15th February, 1971 (as amended) on health problems affecting trade in fresh poultrymeat;
 - the transport vehicles or containers and the loading conditions of this consignment meet the hygiene requirements laid down in the Directive;
 - the poultrymeat preparations described above were obtained under the conditions of production and inspection laid down in Directive 88/657/EEC laying down the requirements for the production and trade in meat preparations and amending Directive 64/433/EEC, 71/118/EEC and 72/462/EEC.
2. Any poultrymeat preparation imported under this licence shall be made available if required for inspection by an Officer of the Department. The importer or his agent shall afford all assistance necessary to such an officer to enable him to carry out the inspection.

NOTES:

Nothing in this licence gives exemption from any prohibition or restriction imposed by the Imported Food Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1991, the Medicines Acts 1968 and 1971 or by any regulation superseding or amending the same.

Any breach of any condition attached to this licence will constitute an offence against the Diseases of Animals (Northern Ireland) Order 1981.
