ORDER.

CIVIL AUTHORITIES (SPECIAL POWERS) ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1922.

I, the Right Hon. Sir Richard Dawson Bates, Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, being the Civil Authority under the Civil Authorities (Special Powers) Act (Northern Ireland), 1922, by virtue of the powers vested in me by the said Act, and the Regulations made thereunder, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, do hereby Order and Require every person within the area specified in the Schedule hereto to remain within doors between the hours of 9-30 o'clock p.m. and 6 o'clock a.m., unless provided with a permit in writing from the Commissioner of Police for the City of Belfast, or some person duly authorised by him.

This Order shall come into force at 9-30 o'clock p.m. on this 20th day of July, 1922.

This Order varies the Order made by me on the 8th day of June, 1922, in so far as that Order prescribed the hours between which persons should remain within doors within the area specified in the Schedule hereto, but not otherwise.

SCHEDULE.

The following area within the County of the City of Belfast,—that is to say: The area enclosed by and including the following roads and streets—Oldpark Road, from the south-east corner of St. Silas's Church to Louisa Street, Louisa Street, thence in a straight line from the end of Louisa Street to the south-west

end of Ardilea Street, and thence in a straight line to Oldpark Road at St. Silas's Church. Provided that St. Silas's Church is not included in the said area, and that through traffic shall be allowed in Oldpark Road up to 11 o'clock p.m.

NOTES.

1. The Order of the 8th June, 1922, imposed Curfew from 11 p.m. to 6 a.m. within the County of the City of Belfast.

2. Under this Order and the Regulations above specified every person who is in the area to which this Order applies during Curfew hours must during those hours either remain in his usual place of abode, or at a hotel or registered lodging house where he is duly registered. If he intends to stay elsewhere during Curfew hours he must give previous notice to the Police at the Police Station nearest to the house where he intends to stay of his intention to stay therein.

3. Inmates of, or persons engaged at schools, hospitals, or other charitable or religious institutions during Curfew hours may remain therein during those hours.

4. This Order will not affect persons conveying to a hospital a person requiring treatment thereat.

5. Existing permits, so long as they are in force, hold good for the periods covered by them, and for the Curfew hours named in this Order.

6. Applications for permits should be made by post to the Commissioner of Police for the City of Belfast.

WHEREAS by Regulation 26 contained in the Schedule to the Civil Authorities (Special Powers) Act (Northern Ireland), 1922, it is provided that the Civil Authority may by notice prohibit the circulation of any newspaper for any specified period, and that any person circulating or distributing such newspaper within such specified period shall be guilty of an offence against the Regulations in said Schedule.

NOW, I, the Right Honourable Sir Dawson Bates, the Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, do hereby prohibit the circulation of the paper entitled, "THE REPUBLIC OF IRELAND"—"Poblact-na-h-Eireann"—in Northern Ireland, until the 7th April, 1923.
