ORDER IN COUNCIL MADE UNDER THE ECONOMY ACT (NORTHERN IRE-LAND), 1931, WITH RESPECT TO NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE.

WHEREAS by the Economy Act (Northern Ireland), 1931, it is enacted that the Governor

of Northern Ireland may, in respect of certain services, including National Health Insurance, make such Orders in the Privy Council of Northern Ireland as appear to the said Governor to be expedient for the purposes of effecting economies in the expenditure falling to be defrayed out of moneys provided by Parliament, or out of any fund established by the enactments relating to any of the said services, and of effecting improvements in the arrangements for meeting such expenditure:

And whereas it is enacted by the said Act that such Orders may (among other things) make provision-

for altering the respective proportions in which expenditure in respect of any such service is to be defrayed out of any fund so established as aforesaid and out of moneys provided by Parliament, and for making transfers and adjustments between any such funds or between any such fund and any other statutory fund; and

for the modification or termination of statutory or contractual rights, obligations and restrictions subsisting at the date when the provisions of the Order take effect:

And whereas it is expedient for the purposes aforesaid that the provisions hereinafter contained shall have effect:

Now, therefore, I, James Albert Edward, Duke of Abercorn, Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, Knight of the Most Illustrious Order of Saint Patrick, Governor of Northern Ireland, by and with the advice of the Privy Council of Northern Ireland, by virtue of the enactments hereinbefore recited and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, do hereby order as follows:-
