Testator directed that after the deaths of the two persons therein mentioned, his Trustees to pay the following pecuniary legacies:—

"The sum of Two Hundred Pounds to the Sustentation Fund; The sum of Two Hundred Pounds to the Augmentation Fund; The sum of One Hundred Pounds for Church Work in Belfast; and One Hundred Pounds for the benefit of the Shankill Mission, all in connection with the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church in Ireland, in recognition of all I owe to the teaching of the said Church and the high ideals of service and duty inculcated by it." And Testator declared the receipt of the Treasurer for the time being of said Funds should be a sufficient discharge to his Executors for same. And Testator further directed that after the death of the person and in the events therein mentioned his Trustees should divide one-half of his Residuary Trust Property among the four Funds of the Presbyterian Church to which I have hereinbefore made bequests, in the same proportion as those bequests, that is to say, to the Sustentation Fund and to the Augmentation Fund each one-third respectively, and for Church Work in Belfast one-sixth, and for the Shankill Road Mission one-sixth of such other half of the proceeds of the Trust Property." And further that on the happening of the events therein mentioned, his Trustees should hold one-half of his Trust Property, or the part thereof undisposed, as therein mentioned in Trust, to divide the same among the said four Presbyterian Funds in said proportions, namely, One-third to each of the first-named Funds, and one-sixth to each of the third and fourth Funds.
