

of scutched flax and any other fibre, or (d) of a mixture of hemp and any other fibre. Including:—(1) The preparing and spinning of waste reclaimed at any stage, and (2) all packing, despatching, warehousing, storing or other operations incidental to or appertaining to any of the above-mentioned work;

“But excluding: (1) The calendering, bleaching, dyeing or finishing of any of the above mentioned materials; and (2) The preparing or spinning of materials required for the making or re-making of (a) rope (including dtiving rope and banding), (b) cord (including blind and window cord, but excluding silk, worsted and other fancy cords), (c) core for wire ropes, (d) lines, (e) twine (including binder and trawl twine), (f) lanyards, (g) net and similar articles, when such spinning or preparing is carried on in the same factory or workshop as the said making or re-making; and (3) The making or repair of sacks or bags; and also (4) The weaving of carpets, rugs and mats.”

##### AERATED WATERS. TRADE BOARD. (Northern Ireland.)

The Trade Board established in Northern Ireland under the powers vested in the Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland, and in pursuance of Section 8 of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, and the enactments modified and adapted by the Government of Ireland (Adaptation of Enactments) (No. 3) Order, 1921, and any other Order of His Majesty in Council made under the said Act of 1920, for those branches of the Aerated Water trade specified in the Regulations of the said Ministry, dated second day of January, 1922, having, as required by Regulations made by the Minister of Labour, under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, dated 31st October, 1918, given due notice on the 28th day of April, 1922, of Proposal to vary certain minimum rates of wages for Male and Female Workers.

The Trade Board have further given notice that they have received notification that an Order was made by the Minister of Labour for Northern Ireland, on the 14th day of July, 1922, confirming the said minimum rates as varied by the Trade Board, as aforesaid, and specifying the 5th day of August, 1922, as the date from which said minimum rates of wages should become effective.

On request to the Trade Board particulars of the minimum rates and information as to their application will be given, if, in the opinion of the Trade Board, the applicant is likely to be affected thereby.
