ABANDONMENT OF HIGHWAY SCHEMES

The Department of the Environment, as part of its ongoing review and reassessment of transportation measures, has concluded that the under mentioned highway schemes should be abandoned:

- W13 - Divis Street/Falls Road
- W20 - Clifton Park Avenue
- W21 - Agnes Street
- W22 - Oldpark Road
- W25 - Cupar Street to Northumberland Street Link

In exercise of its powers under Article 6 of the Planning (Northern Ireland) Order 1991 the Department hereby gives notice that it proposed to alter the Belfast Urban Area Plan 2001 (BUA Plan) accordingly by modifying the list of "Other Highway Schemes" referred to in Policy TR-11 and identified in Appendix 8 of the statutory plan.

The Department has consulted Belfast City Council in respect of the proposed alteration.

The schemes affected are indicated on the BUA Plan Development Strategy Map which is available for inspection at the Divisional Planning Office, Bedford House, 16-22 Bedford Street, Belfast BT2 7FD, from 11th April to 25th April 1997, during normal business hours. Details of the relevant schemes are also available for inspection.

Objections must be received not later than 23rd May 1997 otherwise they cannot be taken into consideration.

Depending on the number and content of objections received the Department may cause a Public Local Inquiry to be held by the Planning Appeals Commission for the purpose of considering those objections which cannot be resolved.

Any such Inquiry will be advertised in due course and objectors will be invited to attend.
