ALTERING THE PROCLAMATION OF THE 4th OCTOBER
1953 DETERMINING A NEW INSCRIPTION FOR GOLD
COINS, REVOKING THE PROCLAMATION OF THE 17th
APRIL 1985, AND ALTERING THE PROCLAMATION OF
THE 19th DECEMBER 1996 DETERMINING A NEW
INSCRIPTION FOR TWO-POUND COINS

Whereas under section 3(1)(b) and (h) of the Coinage Act 1971 We have power, with the advice of Our Privy Council, by Proclamation to determine the design of any coin to be made at Our Mint and to alter any Proclamation previously made under the said section:

And Whereas by Our Proclamation dated the fourth day of October 1953 We determined new designs for gold, silver, cupro-nickel, mixed metal and bronze coins:

And Whereas by Our Proclamation dated the seventeenth day of April 1985 We altered Our Proclamation of the fourth day of October 1953 and determined a new inscription for gold coins specified in the said Proclamation, being the five-pound piece, the two-pound piece, the sovereign and the half-sovereign:

And Whereas by Our Proclamation dated the nineteenth day of December 1996 We determined the specification and design of two-pound coins:

We, therefore, in pursuance of the said section 3(1)(b) and (h) and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, proclaim, direct and ordain as follows:-

 The following paragraph shall be substituted for the paragraph headed "GOLD COINS" of Our said Proclamation of the fourth day of October 1953:-

GOLD COINS

(1) Five-Pound Piece – Every five-pound piece shall have for the obverse impression Our effigy with the inscription "ELIZABETH.II.DEI.GRA REGINA.FID.DEF" and for the

reverse the image of Saint George armed, sitting on horseback, attacking the dragon with a sword, and a broken spear upon the ground, and the date of the year. The coin shall have a graining upon the edge.

- (2) Two-Pound Piece Every two-pound piece shall have the same obverse and reverse impression and inscription in all respects as the five-pound piece. The coin shall have a graining upon the edge.
- (3) Sovereign Every sovereign shall have the same obverse and reverse impression and inscription in all respects as the five-pound piece. The coin shall have a graining upon the edge.
- (4) Half-sovereign Every half-sovereign shall have the same obverse and reverse impression and inscription in all respects as the five-pound piece. The coin shall have a graining upon the edge.".
- Our said Proclamation of the seventeenth day of April 1985 is hereby revoked.
- The following paragraph shall be substituted for paragraph 5 of Our said Proclamation of the nineteenth day of December 1996:-
 - "5. The design of the said new coins shall be as follows:
 - For the obverse impression Our effigy encircled by the inscription "ELIZABETH.II.DEI.GRA.REG.FID. DEF" and for the reverse a design in four concentric circles representing stages in technological development from the Iron Age to the modern computer, with the words "TWO POUNDS" above and the date of the year. The coins shall have a graining upon the edge and all save the gold coin shall have in incuse letters the inscription "STANDING ON THE SHOULDERS OF GIANTS"."
- This Proclamation shall come into force on the eighteenth day of December One thousand nine hundred and ninety seven.

A PROCLAMATION

DETERMINING THE SPECIFICATIONS AND DESIGN FOR FIFTY PENCE COINS COMMEMORATING THE UNITED KINGDOM'S PRESIDENCY OF THE EUROPEAN UNION AND THE TWENTY-FIFTH ANNIVERSARY OF THE UNITED KINGDOM'S ACCESSION TO THE EUROPEAN ECONOMIC COMMUNITY

Whereas under section 3(1)(a), (b), (c), (cc), (d) and (dd) of the Coinage Act 1971 We have power, with the advice of Our Privy Council, by Proclamation to determine the denomination, design, dimensions, weight, fineness and composition of coins to be made at Our Mint, and to determine the remedy to be allowed in the making of such coins and their least current weight:

And Whereas it appears to Us desirable to order that, to commemorate the United Kingdom's Presidency of the European Union and the twenty-fifth anniversary of the United Kingdom's Accession to the European Economic Community, there should be made at Our Mint in gold, in silver and in cupro-nickel, new coins of the denomination of fifty pence:

We, therefore, in pursuance of the said section 3(1)(a), (b), (c), (cc), (d) and (dd) and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, proclaim, direct and ordain as follows:-

GOLD COIN

- (1) A new coin of gold of the denomination of fifty pence shall be made, being a coin of a standard weight of 15.5 grammes, a standard diameter of 27.3 millimetres, and a standard composition of eleven-twelfths fine gold and onetwelfth alloy, and being in the shape of an equilateral curve heptagon.
 - (2) In the making of the said gold coin a remedy (that is, a variation from the standard weight or composition specified above) shall be allowed of an amount not exceeding the following, that is to say:-
 - (a) a variation from the said standard weight of an amount per coin of 0.065 grammes; and
 - (b) a variation from the said standard composition of two per mille.
 - (3) The least current weight of the said gold coin shall be 15.4 grammes.

SILVER COINS

- 2. (1) A new coin of silver of the denomination of fifty pence shall be made, being a coin of a standard weight of 8 grammes, a standard diameter of 27.3 millimetres, and a standard composition of thirty-seven-fortieths fine silver and three-fortieths alloy, or millesimal fineness 925, and being in the shape of an equilateral curve heptagon.
 - (2) In the making of the said silver coin a remedy (that is, a variation from the standard weight, diameter or fineness specified above) shall be allowed of an amount not exceeding the following, that is to say:-
 - (a) a variation from the said standard weight of an amount per coin (measured as the average of a sample of not more than one kilogramme of the coin) of 0.075 grammes;
 - (b) a variation from the said standard diameter of 0.125 millimetres per coin; and
 - (c) a variation from the said millesimal fineness of five per mille.
- 3. (1) A new coin of silver of the denomination of fifty pence shall be made, being a coin of a standard weight of 16 grammes, a standard diameter of 27.3 millimetres, and a standard composition of thirty-seven-fortieths fine silver and three-fortieths alloy, or millesimal fineness 925, and being in the shape of an equilateral curve heptagon.
 - (2) In the making of the said silver coin a remedy (that is, a variation from the standard weight, diameter or fineness

specified above) shall be allowed of an amount not exceeding the following, that is to say:-

- (a) a variation from the said standard weight of an amount per coin (measured as the average of a sample of not more than one kilogramme of the coin) of 0.095 grammes;
- (b) a variation from the said standard diameter of 0.125 millimetres per coin; and
- (c) a variation from the said millesimal fineness of five per mille.

CUPRO-NICKEL COIN

- 4. (1) A new coin of cupro-nickel of the denomination of fifty pence shall be made, being a coin of a standard weight of 8 grammes, a standard diameter of 27.3 millimetres, and a standard composition of seventy-five per centum copper and twenty-five per centum nickel, and being in the shape of an equilateral curve heptagon.
 - (2) In the making of the said cupro-nickel coin a remedy (that is, a variation from the standard weight, diameter or composition specified above) shall be allowed of an amount not exceeding the following, that is to say:-
 - (a) a variation from the said standard weight of an amount per coin (measured as the average of a sample of not more than one kilogramme of the coin) of 0.045 grammes;
 - (b) a variation from the said standard diameter of 0.125 millimetres per coin; and
 - a variation from the said standard composition of two per centum.

DESIGN OF THE COINS

- 5. The design of the said coins shall be as follows:-
 - For the obverse impression Our effigy with the inscription "ELIZABETH.II.D.G REG.F.D." and the date of the year, and for the reverse a celebratory arrangement of stars with the letters "EU" between the anniversary dates "1973" and "1998" and, below, the value "50 PENCE". The coins shall have a plain edge.
- This Proclamation shall come into force on the eighteenth day of December One thousand nine hundred and ninetyseven.

DETERMINING THE SPECIFICATIONS AND DESIGN FOR FIVE-POUND COINS COMMEMORATING THE FIFTIETH BIRTHDAY OF HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES

Whereas under section 3(1)(a), (b), (cc), (d), (dd) and (ff) of the Coinage Act 1971 We have power, with the advice of Our Privy Council, by Proclamation to determine the denomination, design, dimensions, weight, fineness and composition of coins to be made at Our Mint, and to determine the remedy to be allowed in the making of such coins and to direct that any coin shall be legal tender for payment of any amount:

And Whereas it appears to Us desirable to order that, to commemorate the fiftieth birthday of His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, there should be made at Our Mint in gold, in silver and in cupro-nickel, coins of the denomination of five pounds:

We, therefore, in pursuance of the said section 3(1)(a), (b), (cc), (d), (dd) and (ff) and of all other powers enabling Us in that

behalf, do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, proclaim, direct and ordain as follows:-

GOLD COIN

 A new coin of gold of the denomination of five pounds shall be made, being a coin of a standard diameter of 38.608 millimetres, and being circular in shape.

SILVER COIN

- 2. (1) A new coin of silver of the denomination of five pounds shall be made, being a coin of a standard weight of 28.2759 grammes, a standard diameter of 38.608 millimetres, and a standard composition of thirty-seven-fortieths fine silver and three-fortieths alloy, or millesimal fineness 925, and being circular in shape.
 - (2) In the making of the said silver coin a remedy (that is, a variation from the standard weight, diameter or composition specified above) shall be allowed of an amount not exceeding the following, that is to say:-
 - (a) a variation from the said standard weight of an amount per coin (measured as the average of a sample of not more than one kilogramme of the coin) of 0.1296 grammes;
 - (b) a variation from the said standard diameter of 0.125 millimetres per coin; and
 - (c) a variation from the said millesimal fineness of five per mille.
 - (3) The said silver coin shall be legal tender for the payment of any amount in any part of Our United Kingdom.

CUPRO-NICKEL COIN

- 3. (1) A new coin of cupro-nickel of the denomination of five pounds shall be made, being a coin of a standard weight of 28.2759 grammes, a standard diameter of 38.608 millimetres, and a standard composition of seventy-five per centum copper and twenty-five per centum nickel, and being circular in shape.
 - (2) In the making of the said cupro-nickel coin a remedy (that is, a variation from the standard weight, diameter or composition specified above) shall be allowed of an amount not exceeding the following, that is to say:-
 - (a) a variation from the said standard weight of an amount per coin (measured as the average of a sample of not more than one kilogramme of the coin) of 0.1296 grammes;
 - (b) a variation from the said standard diameter of 0.125 millimetres per coin; and
 - (c) a variation from the said standard composition of two per centum.
 - (3) The said cupro-nickel coin shall be legal tender for the payment of any amount in any part of Our United Kingdom.

Design of the Coins

4. The design of the said coins shall be as follows:

For the obverse impression Our effigy with the inscription "ELIZABETH.II.D.G REG.F.D." and the date of the year, and for the reverse the effigy of His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales, a ribbon on which appear the words "THE PRINCE'S TRUST" and "HELPING YOUNG PEOPLE TO SUCCEED", in the background, words relating to the work of The Prince's Trust, and, around, the circumscriptions "FIFTIETH BIRTHDAY OF H.R.H. THE PRINCE OF WALES" and "FIVE POUNDS" flanked by the anniversary dates "1948" and "1998". The coins shall have a graining on the edge.

This Proclamation shall come into force on the eighteenth day of December One thousand nine hundred and ninetyseven.


