NOTICE BY THE BANK OF ENGLAND  
CALLING IN TRANSFERRED  
CURRENCY NOTES.

WHEREAS it is enacted by sub-section (1) of section 4 of the Currency & Bank Notes Act, 1928, that all currency notes issued under the Currency & Bank Notes Act, 1914, certified by the Treasury to be outstanding on the appointed day, namely the 22nd November, 1928 (but not including currency notes called in but not cancelled), shall for the purpose of the enactments relating to bank notes and the issue thereof be deemed to be bank notes and the Bank of England shall be liable in respect thereof accordingly:

And Whereas it is enacted by sub-section (2) of section 4 of the Currency & Bank Notes Act, 1928, that the currency notes to which sub-section (1) of that section applies are referred to in the said Act as "the transferred currency notes":

And Whereas it is enacted by sub-section (3) of section 4 of the said Act that the Bank of England shall have power on giving not less than three months' notice in the London, Edinburgh and Belfast Gazettes to call in the transferred currency notes on exchanging them for bank notes of the same value:

And Whereas certain of the transferred currency notes still remain in circulation and it is desirable that they should be called in:

Now, therefore, the Bank of England, in pursuance of their powers in that behalf, hereby call in the transferred currency notes on the 31st July, 1933, for exchange for bank notes of the same value: accordingly, as from the 1st August, 1933, transferred currency notes will cease to be current or legal tender within the United Kingdom.

GOVERNMENT LOANS.

In excess of 35 years (maximum 50 years) (b) ...  $4\frac{1}{4}$  per cent.

#### II. Land and Works Loans.

(B) Machinery and Equipment Loans:—To Farmers for the purchase of agricultural machinery and equipment, etc.:—

Not exceeding 5 years (b) ...  $4\frac{1}{8}$  per cent.

(C) Minor Land Improvement Loans:—To Farmers for the purchase or erection of—

(i) Agricultural buildings—

Not exceeding 5 years (a) ...  $4\frac{1}{8}$  per cent.

(ii) Silos Concrete (structure)—

Not exceeding 20 years (a) ...  $4\frac{1}{8}$  per cent.

(iii) Silos Wooden (structure)—

Not exceeding 10 years (a) ...  $4\frac{1}{8}$  per cent.

(D) Sea or Inland Fishery—For the purchase of boats, engines or equipment:—

(1) Not exceeding 5 years (a) and (b) ...  $4\frac{1}{8}$  per cent.

(2) Exceeding 5 years (a) and (b) ...  $4\frac{1}{4}$  per cent.

(E) Schools.—

(i) Secondary and Preparatory Schools—To the Governors or Trustees of Preparatory, Intermediate and Secondary Schools, for:—

(1) The purchase and erection of school equipment—

Not exceeding 10 years (a) ...  $4\frac{1}{8}$  per cent.

(2) The establishment and equipping of school libraries—

Not exceeding 5 years (a) ...  $4\frac{1}{8}$  per cent.

- (3) The purchase, erection, extension or alteration of school buildings—

Not exceeding 35 years (a) ...  $4\frac{1}{8}$  per cent.

(ii) Public Elementary Schools—

For the purchase, erection or improvement of schools under the Schools and Training Colleges (Ireland) Act, 1884, and the Education Acts (Northern Ireland), 1923-1931—

Not exceeding 35 years (a) ...  $4\frac{1}{8}$  per cent.

#### IV. Other Loans.

The rate of interest to be charged on local land and works, and development loans other than those defined in Parts I, II and III of this Notice will be determined by the Ministry of Finance according to the circumstances of each individual case.

Note.—Method of Repayment.

Loans marked "(a)" above are repayable by an annuity or rent charge, calculated to include interest at the rates specified. Loans marked "(b)" above are repayable by equal half-yearly instalments of the principal advanced, together with interest on the balance from time to time outstanding. The method of repayment of loans under the Drainage Acts (Northern Ireland), 1925 and 1931, will normally be under method (b), but in special cases the Ministry may require payment under method (a).

#### SAFEGUARDING OF INDUSTRIES ACT, 1921, AS AMENDED BY SECTION 10 OF THE FINANCE ACT, 1926.

##### LISTS OF ARTICLES CHARGEABLE WITH DUTY UNDER PART I.

(Safeguarding of Key Industries).

The Board of Trade make the following announcement:—

1. Section 1 (5) of the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921, provides that for the purpose of preventing disputes arising as to whether any goods are or are not chargeable with duty under Part I of the Act, the Board of Trade may from time to time issue lists defining the articles which are to be taken as falling under any of the general descriptions set out in the Schedule to the Act, and where any list is so issued defining the articles which are to be taken as falling under such general description, the said Schedule shall have effect as if the articles comprised in the list were therein substituted for that general description.

2. The Board of Trade have prepared the accompanying additional lists which to the extent to which they add to the lists previously issued, are to be regarded as further defining the articles which are to be taken as falling under the following general descriptions in the Schedule to the Act, viz.:—

Optical instruments. (See List B (iii)).  
Scientific glassware. (See List C (iii)).  
Scientific instruments. (See List E (iii)).

Synthetic organic chemicals (other than synthetic organic dyestuffs, colours and colouring matters imported for use as such, and organic intermediate products imported for their manufacture) analytical re-agents, all other fine chemicals (except sulphate of quinine of vegetable origin) and chemicals manufactured by fermentation processes. (See List H (iii)).

3. Headings or items in these lists are not to be deemed for the purposes of these lists to include within their scope any articles or substances specified in any previous list issued by the Board of Trade.

4. Articles included in any of the accompanying lists will, subject to the provisions of the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921, be chargeable with duty under Part I of the Act, as amended, on and after the 12th May, 1933.

5. The following general descriptions were, *inter alia*, added to the Schedule to the Act by Section 10 of the Finance Act, 1926:—

Component parts of such optical instruments as are chargeable with duty under Section 1 of the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921.

##### Remarks.

Synthetic organic dyestuffs, colours, and colouring matters imported for use as such and organic intermediate products imported for their manufacture are not liable to duty under Part I of the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921.

Synthetic organic dyestuffs, colours, and colouring matters and organic intermediate products used in the manufacture thereof are, however, liable to duty under Part I of the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921, when not exempted in the circumstances indicated above.

When any organic chemical in this list includes a simple or compound radical which is not qualified by mono, di, tri, tetra, etc., the list is to be read as including all forms of the chemical covered by the introduction of such qualifications of that radical.

When any organic chemical in this list includes a simple or compound radical which is not qualified by ortho, meta, para, alpha, beta, iso, etc., the list is to be read as including all forms of the chemical covered by the introduction of such qualifications of that radical.

This list is to be read as also including the salts of any amino and other basic organic compounds named therein.
