ORDER.

CIVIL AUTHORITIES (SPECIAL POWERS) ACT (NORTHERN 1RELAND), 1922.

I, The Right Honourable Sir Richard Dawson Bates, Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, being the Civil Authority under the Civil Authorities (Special Powers) Act (Northern Ireland), 1922, by virtue of the powers vested in me by the said Act and the Regulations made thereunder, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, do hereby order and require that every person within the County of the City of Belfast shall

remain within doors between the hours of 11-30 o'clock p.m., and 6 o'clock a.m., unless provided with a Permit in writing from the Commissioner of Police for the City of Belfast, or some person duly authorised by him.

Provided that any Permit granted under this Order may be revoked at any time by the person authorised to issue the same, who shall in every such case send notice in writing to the person to whom the Permit was granted of its having been revoked.

This Order shall come into force at 11 o'clock p.m. on the 25th day of September, 1922.

This Order varies the Order made by me on the 8th day of June, 1922, in so far as that Order prescribed the hours between which persons should remain within doors within the County of the City of Belfast, but not otherwise.
