

IN THE HIGH COURT OF JUSTICE IN
NORTHERN IRELAND.

KING'S BENCH DIVISION—IN BANKRUPTCY

JAMES HAGAN, of Cargyreevy, in the County of Down, Farmer, was on the 19th day of December, 1933, adjudged Bankrupt.

PUBLIC SITTINGS will be held before the Court at the Royal Courts of Justice, Belfast, on Friday, the 19th day of January, 1934, and on Friday, the 26th day of January, 1934, at the hour of Eleven o'clock in the forenoon, whereat the Bankrupt is to attend, and to make a full disclosure and discovery of his Estate and Effects.
