CIVIL AUTHORITIES (SPECIAL POWERS) ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1922 and 1933.

Whereas certain Regulations for Peace and Order in Northern Ireland are contained in the Schedule to the Civil Authorities (Special Powers) Act (Northern Ireland), 1922, and it is provided by sub-section (3) of section 1 of the said Act that the Minister of Home Affairs shall have power to make Regulations: (a) for making further provisions for the preservation of the Peace and Maintenance of Order, and (b) for varying or revoking any provision of the Regulations, whether contained in the said Schedule, or made as aforesaid, and that any Regulations made as aforesaid shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act, have effect and be enforced in like manner as Regulations contained in the said Schedule:

Now Therefore, I, the Right Honourable Sir Richard Dawson Bates, Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, do make the following Regulation for making further provision for the preservation of the Peace and Maintenance of Order, and the said Regulation shall be enforced and have effect in like manner as Regulations contained in the said Schedule, and the said Regulation now made and the Regulations contained in the said Schedule shall have effect and be construed as if the said Regulation now made formed part of said Regulations in said Schedule, that is to say:

- 3A. The manufacture, sale, purchase, transfer, or disposal of any explosive substance is prohibited, unless the following conditions are complied with:
 - (1) That the consent in writing of the Inspector-General, a County Inspector, or a District Inspector of the Royal Ulster Constabulary, has been obtained after a full and true disclosure of the particulars of the proposed manufacture, sale, purchase, transfer, or disposal of the said explosive substance.
 - (2) That any person selling the said explosive substance shall provide and keep a register in which shall be entered within twenty-four hours full particulars of the amount and the description of all such substances received by or disposed of by such person, which particulars shall include the names and full addresses of the persons from whom the said substance was received, or to whom it was disposed of, and the dates of such transaction. The said register shall be open for inspection at all times by the District Inspector of the Royal Ulster Constabulary of the district, or any member of the Royal Ulster Constabulary authorised by him, and any person so receiving or disposing of such substance shall at all times when so required by the aforesaid Police Authorities, show to the said Authorities all stock on hands of such substance, together with all invoices, consignment notes, receipts, or permits which may be required to verify

any entry in the Register, and shall allow copies and extracts to be taken by such authorities, and shall allow such authorities at all reasonable times to enter the places where such explosives are stored or kept for sale. Where the person receiving such substance is not known to the vendor, the vendor shall require such person to furnish satisfactory particulars of identification (which shall be entered in the register referred to) and to sign his name and address to such register.

- (3) That no person shall sell or purchase any explosive substance in any quantity in excess of, or different in description from that named in the permit.
- (4) That a dealer in explosives shall be required to keep all invoices, consignment notes, receipts, and permits, for a period of one year, from the date of the transaction to which they relate.
- (5) That no person shall make in any Register or document which he is required to keep under the Order, any entry which is false or misleading in any material particular.
