THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS FOR NORTHERN IRELAND.

THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1898 to 1922.
URBAN DISTRICT OF DUNGANNON.

To the Council of the Urban District of Dungannon; and to all others whom it may concern:

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act (Northern Ireland), 1922 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is provided that on and after the ordinary day of election in the year nineteen hundred and twenty-three the members of the Council of an urban district in Northern Ireland shall be elected for wards or urban districts instead of for the local electoral areas formed under the Local Government (Ireland) Act, 1919:

And whereas by section 7 of the Act it is provided that the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland may make an order dividing an urban district into wards, and fixing the boundaries of such wards, altering the number and boundaries of the wards or altering the boundaries of the wards without altering their number, and apportioning the urban district councillors among the wards, and that the Ministry may make such orders as appear to it to be necessary or proper for giving full effect to the Act, and that before making an order for the purpose the Ministry shall consult with the Council of the urban district, and may if the Ministry deems it necessary hold a local inquiry into the matter of any representations made by any such Council:

And whereas the Urban District of Dungannon is divided into three wards, called respectively the Central Ward, the East Ward, and the West Ward:

And whereas the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland has consulted with the Council of the Urban District of Dungannon, and considered representations made by the said Council for the alteration of the boundaries of the aforesaid wards.

And whereas the Ministry does not deem it necessary to hold any local inquiry into the matter aforesaid:

Now, therefore, the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland in exercise of the powers vested in it by the Local Government Acts (Northern Ireland), 1898 to 1922, and of all other powers in that behalf enabling the Ministry, hereby orders and directs as follows:—

- 1. The boundaries of the existing wards of the Urban District of Dungannon are hereby altered, and on, from and after the date of this Order the boundaries and contents of the three wards of the Urban District, namely, the Central Ward, the East Ward, and the West Ward, shall be those set forth in the second column of the Schedule hereunto annexed.
- 2. All members of the Urban District Council of Dungannon in Office on the 15th day of January, 1923, shall retire on the 16th day of January, 1923.
- 3. On the 15th day of January, 1923, there shall be elected seven members for each of
