ROAD AND RAILWAY TRANSPORT ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1935.

Order made by the Minister of Home Affairs under Section 14 of the Road and Railway Transport Act (Northern Ireland), 1935, extending the period within which the scheme for Pooling Receipts of the Northern Ireland Road Transport Board and the Railway Companies may be prepared.

I, the Right Honourable Sir Richard Dawson Bates, Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by Section 14 of the Road and Railway Transport Act (Northern Ireland), 1935 (in this Order referred to as "the Act"), and of all other powers in that behalf enabling me, but without prejudice to any further exercise of such powers, hereby order and direct that the period within which the Joint Committee estab-
